Listen Love

On the last Sunday of Epiphany we heard the story from the gospel of Mark of Jesus' transfiguration. It was my turn to preach and a great part of my sermon was on the words of God spoken to the disciples. "This is my Son, the beloved, listen to him." This commandment is given to the disciples and to all of us who follow Jesus and struggle with the simple task of paying attention to what Jesus has to say for our lives. The rhetorical question asked near the end of the sermon continues to haunt me. "What must Jesus do before his disciples would finally listen? What must Jesus do before we will listen? Die?" Of course we know that answer to such a question; Jesus would indeed die. Yet the question remains. Are we listening?

When Jesus suffered and died upon the cross because of us and for us he prayed an anguished prayer, "Father forgive them." What more powerful words can we hear than those of forgiveness offered by the Son of God? Yet what do we choose to do with such words? Do such words direct our lives and the way we live and treat others? It has long been my thought that far too often we give little thought as to how our actions, words and the choices of our lives affect others. Yet each and every one of us can have a profound effect on the lives of others and this extends beyond our family and friends to include the communities in which we live and even our community of faith. I am always amazed when people think that their absence or presence in worship doesn't matter to others. Because indeed your presence in church does make a difference and when you are absent, the community of faith feels that absence.

In one of the first churches I ever served there was an elderly man who sat in the back corner of the church every Sunday. He would come in quietly just after the service began and would duck out just as quietly at the conclusion of the benediction. No one really knew who he was but no one could remember a time when he hadn't occupied that back corner. Then one day I got a call from a woman who asked if I could go to the hospital and visit with her dying husband. When I walked into the hospital room there on the edge of the bed was the mystery man of the back pew. We had a wonderful conversation and I discovered that he had been worshipping at that church for nearly 60 years but had never joined preferring to remain anonymous. In the weeks to come we became friends and I learned that he had no worth.

He died never having the opportunity to return to his favorite pew. Yet after he was gone everybody knew it; his absence was felt and all acknowledged that this purposeful stranger had done more than occupy a pew; he had come to occupy a place in the heart of the congregation and when he died he was missed. There

was a double tragedy to be found in his passing; first, this man never understood that his loving gentle spirit was a profound gift from God that would have meant so much to the congregation of which he was a part. Secondly, the congregation had failed to reach out and embrace this child of God.

Jesus said to him, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and most important command. The second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself. All the Law and the Prophets depend on these two commands." (Matthew 22) God said 'listen' and Jesus said 'love.' So often we fail to do either; the world and the church are poorer for it. We often spend so much time looking for the place where they might feel as if they belong and have a purpose. The problem is that we have simply failed to love where we are at; we have failed to make real Jesus' commandment to love God and love our neighbor in the very place where we are at. Our failure is the result of not appreciating that our lives indeed make a difference in the very place where we live and work and serve.

Our world today has infected us with a restless spirit that makes it very hard for us to listen or to love. The constant strain for something else often blinds us and makes us deaf to God's calling to serve where we are presently at; our home, our family, our work and our church. Look around you – here are the ones to whom the Lord Jesus has called you to live out your ministry of making his love real. Do not underestimate your place and purpose in this life; for you are indeed a child of God and have been given the great honor to serve the living Lord.

God bless you as you hear His calling for your life and live out the love of God in the place where you have been called to serve. Remember Jesus died for us all and asks that we might make His life giving love real in the world by our service to Him our Lord and Savior. Amen.

Do Not Live As People Without Hope

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing; so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." Romans 15:13

It has been said that there are three great virtues or marks of the Christian life. They are *faith, love* and *hope*. This month, I'd like to share with you a few reflections on what it means to be "people abounding in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

Although "hope" is a word embedded with theological meaning, it has become a word used commonly in our language. Yet, its use is often quite shallow. "I hope you feel better," we tell people with everything from the common cold to a serious illness. "I hope I did well on that test," is the mantra of every student planning to graduate. "I hope you have a nice day," we call out to friends and strangers. After using these common phrases, we go about our own business, rarely giving our words a second thought.

In society, hope is normally seen as the anticipation of the fulfillment of our desires. We are most acutely aware of our need for hope when things aren't going well. We grasp for hope when there is uncertainty in our health or a change in our family relationships or when we face the loss of a job or the bleakness of our economic situation. That's when we see the need for hope; and our hope is that the situation will turn out as we think it should.

On the other hand, when God speaks of "hope" it is filled with a far deeper meaning. God's hope is given to us (yes, a gift) so that we might find our way forward when the fog is so thick that we can't make out the path. AND God's hope also is given to us when everything seems under control and we don't even think we need any help!! In fact, the ordinary circumstances of everyday life are the best times to learn to live as people abounding in hope. This hope helps to shape us into people who trust in our Lord more strongly than we trust in ourselves.

There are many things in life that are nice to have, but we can live without them. Hope is not one of those things! Hope is absolutely essential for our well-being as people and our faithfulness as Jesus' disciples. I personally think it is part of being created in God's image. Like God, the fountain of all hopefulness, we too have hope in our DNA. So, what is this hope? I believe that the best way to describe Christ-centered hope is "the trust in the One who journeys with us." Our hope is not grounded in a particular outcome, but our hope is lodged in Jesus Christ. What will tomorrow bring? I don't know, but I know Jesus will be there with you! What will the report from the doctor say? I don't know, but I know that Jesus is holding you securely in His eternal care. Where will you be five years from now? I don't know, but wherever it is, God's love in Jesus will be there surrounding you!

The weeks of Lent invite us to contemplate the extreme measures that God has taken to stay in relationship with

humanity. That's what hope is in the end....it's a relationship. When you live and trust in God's eternal care you will see the endless imagination that God has for making all things new again!!!

The hope that God plants deep within us transforms our lives so that we can live as people of hope in all of the changes and challenges of life. My friends in Christ, may we be people who "abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

Diabetes Alert

Are you at risk for developing type 2 diabetes? The American Diabetes Association holds Diabetes Alert Day in March to call attention to diabetes and to encourage everyone to find out if they are at risk. It is a one day wake up call, asking the American public to take the Diabetes Risk test.

Because type 2 diabetes develops slowly, some people have no symptoms. Early diagnosis is critical to successful treatment and to delaying or preventing long term complications such as kidney disease, eye disease, nervous system disease, heart attack, and stroke. Studies have shown that better control of blood sugar, cholesterol, and blood pressure in persons with diabetes helps reduce the risk of developing those complications.

What should you do? If you are overweight or have a family history of diabetes, ask your doctor about getting tested for diabetes (this involves a simple blood test). The National Institutes of Health recommends that anyone age 45 or older should consider getting tested.

If you or someone you know has diabetes, or if you want to assess your risk of developing diabetes, please come to the table in the lower gathering space on **Sunday, March 11 from 8:45-11:30 am**. I will have information about managing diabetes, as well as the Diabetes Risk test. (If you are unable to stop by the table, you can take the test online at <u>www.diabetes.org</u> under the Diabetes Basics tab). I look forward to answering your questions about diabetes!
