Reflections on a Soggy Walk

I have become increasingly aware that all of life can be observed as a series of unfolding parables; events in life that can serve to teach and inform us about things that matter most in life. One such moment for me was my recent participation in the annual Carroll County Crop Walk, an event that raises funds for Church World Services, an agency that, since 1946, has been addressing the issues of world hunger. In 2010 it was estimated that 925 million people daily face the reality of hunger and possible starvation. So on a cold, windy and rainy Sunday I joined approximately a hundred other people in a walk to raise funds and awareness concerning this ongoing global crisis.

I would like to say that my motivation was noble and that I joyfully marched those five miles. But in truth I began the walk as a rather reluctant participant. If Yvonne Aasen, Helen Englar, Jan Mickey and Randy Landy had not been waiting for me, I fear I might have found an excuse to stay home. Jan was working the registration table and the other three were walking and a whole bunch of people from Grace had pledged financial support if I completed the five miles. So I abandoned the luxury of a good lunch and a warm house and walked with the intrepid members of Grace. I would like to report that each step along the way was filled with a sense of solidarity for the hungry and poor of the world, however most of the walk was filled with lament; a selfish lament of complaint for a raincoat that leaked, shoes that got soaked and five miles that somehow felt like fifty. Yet the ninety minutes or so that it took to complete the course was indeed a parable of sorts; learning about the importance of community and a reminder of what it means to serve. In very brief summary it was the encouragement and support of others that got me to walk and that service indeed does require us to put aside our personal wants to care for the needs of others.

In reflecting on the walk I was reminded that self-centeredness is one of the greatest enemies to a life of service and the mission of the Church. But this is not a black and white issue rather it is a struggle of varying degrees of gray. Service requires us to sacrifice, yet at what cost? There are the competing needs of work and family. We have obligations and we dread disappointing others who are close to us. I recall this in my struggle to consider entering the ministry; I saw myself walking away from important work as a social worker. My hometown pastor counseled me that what too often gets in the way of service to the Lord is not the choices between good and evil, but rather between better and best. In our contemporary American culture there are all sorts of wonderful things that compete with our Lord's call to service and deciding will always be difficult.

My most important learning from my soggy walk -- I had a great time! I had the opportunity to join with others in a shared mission; the common plight of being

wet and cold; yet knowing that we were making a difference. In the midst of the walk I became much better acquainted with a fellow member of Grace. I learned of the dedication of so many men and women who desire to make our world a better place. I learned that God still calls and people indeed heed that call.

This summer there are two mission trips in which our congregation is involved. Senior high youth are invited to join with me in traveling to Washington DC to spend a week helping out the poor who live in neighborhoods surrounding our nation's Capital. Adults can join us on a mission trip to Schoharie, NY. Yes, there are all sorts of good reasons to consider as to why you can't make such a commitment but I am inviting you to consider if perhaps God is calling, to make a different choice. Who knows what you might learn about yourself?

Pentecost Continues!

The four Sundays in May will include important celebrations and recognitions related to our life as a community of faith.

- On May 6, we will hold one of our two annual meetings as a congregation. We are reminded of the importance of the commitments that we make and the ministries in which we engage as a group of people called together by the Holy Spirit.
- On May 13, we celebrate Mother's Day, an opportunity to give thanks not only for our own mothers, but for all of those women who have been examples and have nurtured us in faith.
- On May 20, in a 10:00 All Grace Worship Service, we will celebrate the Affirmation of Baptism (Confirmation) of nine of our young people. They now take their places in the adult membership of our congregation.
- On May 27 we will celebrate the Festival of Pentecost at all four of our worship services. We will recall the coming of the Holy Spirit which calls and creates the Body of Christ in the world. New members will be received during these worship services as well. I have special plans for the children's sermon that day also! (I promise....this one will be much quieter than the children's sermons on Easter!)

As the Lenten season draws our attention to the Passion of Jesus, and Easter reminds us of his resurrection, these Sundays in May help us focus not only on the birth of the Church but also on its expansion and growth. From a small movement in a confined geographical area, Christianity has become a worldwide influence.

Unfortunately, during this time in which we are living, we have to acknowledge that the decline of the Church is

also on our minds! Those of us who have lived for several decades or more sadly can testify to the shirking size and influence of the Church. We now live in a world with countless options for our time and resources. The religious landscape has become much more diverse. Our world is fast paced, filled with noise and technology, and Sunday worship and learning is no longer a priority even in many homes where the people do identify themselves as Christian. The list of changes and challenges can go on, but you have the idea....you can add your own observations.

So, what do we do about all of this? I for one am not ready to throw up my hands in discouragement. I still believe that faith in God is the most basic human need. I believe that God's best and fullest revelation of himself is found in Jesus. I believe that without the Holy Spirit's power at work in the world, this would be a very, very sad place. So, I want to continue to share the Gospel message, continue to call people to faith in Christ, and continue to call Jesus' disciples to deeper use of spiritual disciplines and more active practice of our faith in our daily lives. With all my heart, I believe that developing our relationship with God is by far the most important aspect in all of life.

Many voices are saying that the church needs to change. Pastor Kevin and I, along with eight other members of Grace, recently attended an event led by The Rev. Dr. David Lose, Preaching Professor at Luther Seminary. Pastor Lose acknowledged that although many of us are still very happy with the church today, we must ask ourselves whether church as we currently know it, is "working for our children and grandchildren." In a world of limitless options, how can we engage our young people in such a way that they will make participation in the Body of Christ a top priority in their lives?

I am coming to the end of my space for this article!!! So, I've given you more questions than answers. But then, I don't yet have the answers!! These are questions that we need to explore together. Whether we are thinking about our worship services, our educational offerings, or our servant role in the community, we all need to ask the pressing questions about how we can tell the Gospel message in such a way that people are drawn in to receive the Bread of Life. By the power of the Holy Spirit, we won't fail.....as we seek to take one step at a time into the future, we have the exciting opportunity to be a part of the continuing growth and expansion of Christ's mission in the world. Thank you for being my partners in this mission!

The month of May will be upon us very soon. Every living thing will be out in the sunshine trying to soak up those life giving rays of sun. This is the season for plants and animals to grow and reproduce to complete their cycles. However, people, that's you - and not the family pet that reads this section - are subject to sun damage, no matter their age or skin color. Please use some common sense and cover up since you don't have a shell...you don't see sunburned terrapins going about do you?

The night time has its issues also, and that makes it hard to escape the almost silent buzz of our not-so-friendly mosquito. Those little critters can multiply in the smallest amount of water that you may not even think possible. The United States ended the Anopheles Mosquito on its soil in 1951 and while you and others in North America and many other parts of the world have the problem under control, other less fortunate countries still have to fight the effects. And, the most likely to be hit by these stealth warriors are the youngest part of our population, the children and infants. **Did you know that a child dies every 60 seconds from mosquito bites outside the United States?** I started doing some research and found that **\$1** can help a child with malaria receive medicine; **\$10.00** can purchase and deliver an insecticide-treated mosquito net that will last a long time. I read that the Lutheran Malaria Initiative is an unprecedented campaign to mobilize U.S. Lutherans to help end malaria deaths in Africa by 2015. This may be a lot to take in so I'll save some of detail on how you and others can join in to help other Lutherans around the world for next month.

Did you know that the Women of the ELCA at Grace already have given money toward mosquito nets? Thanks, ladies!!!!

Everyone, please continue to support me and my monthly aid programs through your continued giving. I got a little side tracked there with that pesky mosquito but who can stop a terrapin when they're fired up about something?

Take care and be safe out there; these are pleasant yet dangerous times...

Michael Card Concert to Benefit Starving Haitians – Infant Deaths have Decreased ... Thanks to The Least of These Ministries

The Least of These Ministries is sponsoring a concert with Christian musician and singer Michael Card on Saturday, May 5, 2012. The concert will be held in Grace Hall at Grace Lutheran Church, 21 Carroll Street, Westminster, Md. In a career that spans 30 years, Michael Card has recorded over 31 albums, authored or co-

authored over 24 books, hosted a radio program, and written for a wide range of magazines. While he has penned such favorites as El Shaddai, Love Crucified Arose, and Emmanuel, he never imagined selling more than 4 million albums or writing over 19 #1 hits. The popularity of his work seemed a stark contrast to his goal in life, to simply and quietly teach the Bible.

Founded in 1999, The Least of These Ministries is an ecumenical Christian organization that is dedicated to assisting the Haitian harvesters who live in work camps in the Dominican Republic. These work camps are known as bateys and offer little more than basic protection from the elements. The Least of These Ministries is dedicated to ministering to the people in the bateys and providing one meal per week of rice and beans and currently feeds 9,000 people on a weekly basis. Generally the meal provided by The Least of These is the best of the 4 or 5 meals these people get for the week. In those bateys where The Least of These have been distributing the meals for several years the infant death rate has decreased from about 36% to about 12%, simply because the mothers of the infants are now able to produce milk.

- Turn off the lights and TV when you are not in the room.
- Use cloth napkins instead of paper napkins.
- Use organic products for the lawn instead of chemicals.
- Pull weeds instead of spraying with chemicals.
- Shop at the farmer's markets in the summer. Buy local produce whenever possible.
- A two-degree adjustment in your thermostat setting (lower in winter, higher in summer) can prevent 500 pounds of carbon dioxide from entering the atmosphere each year.
