Celebrating Ministry

It is difficult to find the right words to say "thank you" for such a wonderful and thoughtful celebration of our 30th Anniversaries of Ordination. We were truly touched by the many dimensions of the surprise celebration planned for us. We will remember with love the arrival of our family here in Westminster and the precious days spent with them. We rejoice that you chose to honor us with seminary scholarships for those who now take their place in the procession of women and men responding to God's call to serve the church as pastors and rostered lay leaders.

The anniversary celebration was in many ways a recognition of the splendid match between pastors and congregation that God created by calling together the Clementsons and Grace Lutheran Church. What we truly celebrated was the joy that pastors and congregation have experienced in our work and service together in these last four and a half years.

The celebration that you initiated has caused us to do a lot of talking and reflecting on our 30 years of ordained ministry, especially the most recent chapter which has been spent with you. Although four and a half years is not really a long time period, our time together has been fairly intense! Together with you we've undertaken the process of healing after significant congregational conflict. We've worked together to define the vision and mission that we believe God has called us to be about in this time and place. We've faced the storm brought about by a significant decision in our denomination to allow persons in same gender relationships to be considered for ordained ministry. We've struggled together to get a handle on how to financially maintain active ministry while paying down a huge debt after the departure of a significant portion of congregational members who voted to take on that large debt. When you look at the list, it is apparent that our time together has been short but intense!!

The celebration reinforced for us how blessed we are to have been called to serve as Co-Senior Pastors here at Grace. "Building relationships with God and community," the brief version of our mission statement, is an accurate description of who we are *together*. As a faith community, we strive to include people of all age groups in our ministry. We readily reach out locally and globally to meet the needs of people. We are paying more and more attention to caring for one another with respect and compassion in the midst of our differences. Yes, we are all truly blessed to be a part of the church family here at Grace.

We give you our deepest thanks for caring for us at this milestone in our ministry as ordained pastors. Please, please, continue to partner with us so that together we will see that this faith community remains strong for future witness and service to our Lord. Your generous offerings, even in these financially difficult times, are needed to carry out the commitments made by our faith community. Your presence in worship, learning, fellowship and service encourages not just us, but our entire church family. Please join us in giving thanks to Almighty God for blessing us all with the opportunity to be a part of Christ's body at work in the world through Grace Lutheran Church.

Columbarium Landscaping to Begin in August

During August, you will see improvements being made to the Columbarium at Grace Lutheran Church. Under the direction of Clyde Hirt, landscaping and a seating area will be added to the Columbarium which is located at the corner of Carroll Street and Kemper Avenue. The work is being paid for from the Columbarium Fund (created by the sale of columbarium niches) and the Meyers Garden Fund. No current or capital funds will be used for this project.

As you look at pre-planning arrangements for your death, please consider the Grace Lutheran Columbarium for your final resting place. Upgrades to the Columbarium demonstrate the congregation's long-term commitment to make this a beautiful and peaceful place for people whose faith has been nurtured and celebrated through Grace Lutheran Church. The Columbarium is currently available to members and close relatives of the members of Grace.

The cost of a niche on our columbarium for an individual is \$1,000; for a couple the cost is \$1,500. At the time of death, there is an opening fee of \$50 and the cost of engraving. Packets of information and application materials are available in the church office. If you have questions, please feel free to speak with one of the pastors.

Well, the 'dog days of summer' are close at hand and there isn't much water left to swim in, let alone enough rain for the corn and tomatoes you all look forward to. I must be lucky because I get some of my fluids from just eating juicy bugs and small fish. How many of you are on public water? If you are, you're fortunate. Even if you have to pay more, at least you can get wet when you want to. Those people on a well have to depend on the rains to soak the ground and penetrate to the well depths required. I've even been told that some homes have to drill a second well and sometimes have nitrogen dumped into their wells to open additional wet areas just to get life giving water; think about it.

I understand that Grace, your church, is participating with other churches in the ELCA on the 100 wells project. From what I heard, the goal is to drill 100 wells in drought stricken areas around the world. I used to wonder why they just didn't dig wells and everyone would have water instead of walking for miles and then having to settle for what you wouldn't drink let alone wash yourself or clothes in. Then I discovered that one of the biggest problems in drilling any well is the fact that the saltwater table is present in a lot of these countries and the fresh drinkable water is very, very deep. Seems like a lot of work for a well doesn't it, but each new well will serve 500 families. How many families do you and your well take care of? Check out this neat computer site for additional information at http://elca.org/100wells and listen as you watch.

The children at Vacation Bible Camp already collected a lot of change to help. Now we are asking the congregation in general to join in during the next few weekends. By all accounts, Margaret & Isaac were just ordinary people. They were plain people, not folks who would stand out in a crowd. Their appearance and manner were modest; simple clothing worn by simple folks.

They must have been members of the church forever. They always seemed to be around. They were pleasant, but rather quiet and unassuming nice people.

Isaac passed away first. Then in 1993 Margaret also passed. The rest of us knew we would miss a couple of our senior members.

But then came the surprise. Isaac and Margaret had decided to leave a legacy to Grace Lutheran Church. That was not the surprise, but rather the magnitude of the gift.

These two lovely people, who looked like they maybe had just enough money to get by, had left Grace Lutheran Church \$302,000! They made their intentions clear: one share of the money was to go to the Lutheran Church Women, one to the Property Committee, one to The Benevolence Fund, and one share unrestricted.

Part of the money was used to convert the Parsonage from a living space into offices. That building continues to bear the same of the Stoners.

The Stoners chose a simple lifestyle far below their economic means. They decided that giving was more satisfying than spending. And their generosity will always be remembered.
