Built on Rock

My father was one of the great mentors of my faith while a child. One text that he loved to reflect upon was the parable of the "Two Foundations." (Matt. 7:24-27) In the gospel of Matthew this parable serves as the conclusion of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. A brief summary of the parable is simply this; a wise man built his house on a rock and a foolish man built his house upon sand. When the storms came, the house built upon the rock withstood the tragedies while the house built upon sand was destroyed. Jesus said, "Therefore, everyone who hears these words of Mine and acts on them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock." My father pointed out that the storms of life come to all of us; how we handle those storms will depend greatly upon what makes up the foundation of our lives. In recent months we have seen many examples of the storms that have assailed the lives of people. The devastation of Hurricane Sandy, the tragedy of Newtown, personal matters of heath (me included), matters of economic uncertainty and this is a list that can go on for pages.

Trapped at home by my own health issues I spent a lot of time in front of a television watching the reports of the tragic shooting in Connecticut. On the Monday following the shooting a reporter for one network noted that her church, also in Connecticut, was filled to overflowing with individuals seeking spiritual solace. Many other reporters also noted that people are trying to make sense of this terrible tragedy. But truth is there is no way to make sense of this tragedy. And we must not forget that these sorts of senseless tragedies have always been a part of our world. An often forgotten commemoration of the Christian Church Calendar is December 28 which is most often called Holy Innocents, and is actually part of the extended Christmas story which tells of wicked King Herod sending his soldiers to Bethlehem and the surrounding region and killing all boys under the age of two. Ironically historians speculate that perhaps 15 to 20 little boys were slaughtered in this moment of time. Evil persists in our world and has marched the path of time from generation to generation.

How then do we meet this reality with any sense of hope? A Presbyterian pastor once wrote; "When I was a boy I would see scary things in the news, my mother would say to me, 'Look for the helpers. You will always find people who are helping.' To this day, especially in times of disaster I remember my mother's words, and I am always comforted by realizing there are so many helpers - so many caring people in this world." The pastor was Fred Rogers who is also known

as Mr. Rogers. In my recent health care scare I can attest to the truth of what Mr. Rogers said for in the anxious moments and days leading up to and following my surgery my life has been filled to overflowing with helpers who cared for me and comforted my family. I suspect that most of you reading this article also have similar examples of those helpers. In Connecticut one lone shooter took the lives of 20 children and six adults. Among those who died were

indeed some helpers who gave their lives so that many more children were saved. And in the moments and days that have followed the helpers have vastly outnumbered the one who lived out evil.

The storms of life assail all of us in our turn and in our time. But all around us is the presence of God who brings his helpers to care for us, to mourn with us and to make real his love for our lives. The Rock upon which the wise man built his house was the certainty of God's eternal love and presence. This knowledge will not stop the storms of life but knowing the certainty of God's ever presence support can help us weather the storms of life and open us to seeing the presence of God. This truth was brought home to me in my recent adventures and in the midst of the storm of life I was overwhelmed by the depth of God's loving care for me made real in the loving hands of his children.

The storms of this life crash all around but the rock of God's abiding love made real in Jesus gives us the rock upon which to build our lives and to also find the strength and courage to then go out into the world and be those helpers who will overwhelm the evil of the moment by making real the eternal love of God.

May your life be ever built upon the rock of God's love so that the storms of life cannot overwhelm you, so that you will be able to see all the ways in which the Lord is with you and hear that calling to be those helpers who will forever overwhelm the hurts of this world with the balm of God's eternal love.

2013 The Year of Luke

As we begin a new calendar year, we are one month into the new church year. Having completed Advent, we are now in the Christmas season and look forward to the celebration of Epiphany on January 6. This year, it is a rare event to celebrate the festival of Epiphany on a Sunday.

During the weeks of 2013, most of our Gospel Readings will come from the Gospel of Luke. When we hear specific pieces of scripture, it is always helpful to understand how that scripture fits into the bigger picture. It is something like picking up a novel and reading a few paragraphs from page 43. If you didn't know what came before that page, the words you read wouldn't tell much of a story. The opening verses of Luke make it clear that the author knows he is not the first person to attempt to write about Jesus, but after careful investigation has decided to take his turn to tell the story. Luke is actually the first of two volumes, the second one being the book of Acts.

Mark Allan Powell, New Testament professor at Trinity Lutheran Seminary in Columbus, Ohio has written: "One way to appreciate the impact that this book has had on religion and culture is to try to envision what Christianity would be like without it. Can we imagine Christmas without shepherds or a baby in a manger? Liturgy without the Magnificat? A church year without Ascension or Pentecost? How many favorite Bible stories would we lose? Zacchaeus, Mary and Martha, the good Samaritan, the prodigal son – all would be gone forever. But, of course, we do have Luke's Gospel."

About half of this lengthy telling of the Gospel is also found in Mark and Matthew, but about half is found nowhere else. When you look closely at Luke, especially the parts that are unique to Luke, you notice a number of themes which reveal the matters that Luke wanted to highlight for those who would read his telling of the Gospel of Jesus.

- Worship and Prayer are of great importance. Often in Luke, you will find people giving thanks. You will see Jesus often at prayer. The reader is encouraged to pray frequently.
- Meals take on an important role in Luke and Acts. It is in Luke's Gospel that Jesus is criticized for eating with the wrong people. Meals often symbolize nourishment and celebration, and in Luke's Gospel, meals are depicted as occasions for healing, hospitality, fellowship, forgiveness, prophetic teaching, and reconciliation.
- Jesus' ministry extends to those who are otherwise excluded. Luke's Gospel shows special concern for outcasts, for victims of oppression, and for others who appear to be at a disadvantage in society. It is

often noted that in Luke, Jesus is especially interested in the poor, women, and those otherwise oppressed.

- Salvation begins today. Luke often uses the word, "today." Salvation begins now as people encounter Jesus and experience the freedom he offers.
- **The Holy Spirit plays a prominent role in Luke and Acts.** The power of the Holy Spirit is at work in Jesus and in his followers.

Many of you have heard me say that the Gospel of Luke is my favorite book in the Bible. While I enjoy delving into all of the Scripture Lessons that are assigned in the three year Lectionary used by our church and many, many others, I most enjoy this Year of Luke. If you'd like to get a head start on the year, take some time to read these passages: Luke 1:46-55; 6:20-26; 7:36-50; 11:1-13; 18:1-8; 24:36-53. Even better would be to read the entire Gospel of Luke so that when we read small pieces of the story you will be prepared to see the bigger picture.

May God bless us on the journey throughout this church year, so that our lives will be challenged, comforted, and enriched by God's grace preparing us to be Christ's disciples in the world!

The WELCA of Grace will meet on **Monday, January 21, 2013 at 1:30 pm** to assemble AIDS/Hospice Kits. The HIV/AIDS Epidemic has added enormous challenges to health care worldwide. Missionaries, their health care worker colleagues and patients' families in third world countries must provide daily care to AIDS patients who suffer from the symptoms of this devastating, end-stage disease. There is pain, nausea, diarrhea, skin eruptions, to name a few. It is not a disease we can ignore and it is not going away.

But what can we do to help? Monetary donations or kit item donations from the congregation are appreciated. An AIDS/Hospice Kit can provide cleanliness and comfort. Our prayers and generosity can reach far into the lives of those who have been affected. WELCA is collecting items in boxes in the Gathering Spaces. Each kit contains:

New items:

1 bath-size bar of hand soap (wrapped)
1 toothbrush
1 tube of toothpaste, medium or large (or two small sample sizes)
1 "Pick" comb
1 Nail clipper
6 Band-aids
1 jar or tube of petroleum jelly
Used devotional book (any time frame, any type – Christ in Our Home, Our Daily Bread, etc.)

Kits will be sent to Global Health Ministries (GHM) which is an organization that provides financial and material support

to Lutheran health care mission programs in developing countries. GHM supporters believe there are significant untapped health care resources in the United States that are desperately needed by Lutheran medical missionaries and the people they serve overseas.

Thank you to those who attended the annual Village Holiday hosted by the Friends of the Village auxiliary on December 1. Photographer Michael Smith unveiled his new photograph and local musician Monte Leister performed selections from his first Christmas CD. Proceeds from the event benefit the reinvention of the Health Care Center and the Diven House for Assisted Living.

Carroll Lutheran Village will become a smoke- and tobacco-free workplace effective January 1, 2013. Employees, contractors and the public may not use tobacco of any kind on campus. "Carroll Lutheran Village is committed to the health and wellbeing of all staff, residents, and visitors," said President/CEO Geary Milliken. Worship Volunteers

Worship Volunteer Lists are being updated – Our worship services at Grace are greatly enhanced by congregational members sharing in the leadership roles. Worship is something that all of God's people do together. While the pastors serve important roles within the worship services, it is important to demonstrate the participation of the laity in leadership as well.

Here is a brief description of each of the roles for which we need volunteers:

Worship Assistants – Participate at all four of our weekly services; these people assist the pastors by reading scripture lessons, leading prayers, and assisting with the distribution of Holy Communion. Worship Assistants in the services in the Sanctuary wear albs (robes) provided by the church.

Readers – In addition to worship assistants, Readers participate by reading the Scripture Lessons for the day at the services in the Sanctuary. Although we have not had Readers at the 9:00 services, we could incorporate people into this role if there are volunteers.

Communion Assistants – At the 9:00 Worship Service, five people are needed in addition to the pastors and worship assistant each week to distribute Holy Communion.

Acolytes – At the services in the Sanctuary, young people who serve as acolytes light the candles before the services, distribute the offering plates, and extinguish the candles at the end of the service. They wear robes and sit in a designated seat in the front of the church during the service. New acolytes will receive training. Currently, our acolytes are in grades 8 – 12; however, we welcome younger children as well. Parents should talk with the pastors if their children are interested in filling this role if they are younger than confirmation age. (We have not yet had acolytes at the 9:00 service but are open to adding them if there are interested young people.)

Ushers – These people distribute bulletins, help to seat people, receive the offering, and provide for general order and safety during our worship services. At the 7:45 service, the ushers also distribute Holy Communion.

Schedules for the above roles are generally prepared for three months at a time by the staff in our church office. **Those who are currently serving are carried over into the next quarter unless they notify the office otherwise**. We are very pleased to welcome others into these roles. So, we ask you to prayerfully consider volunteering for one or more of these positions. We will be taking new volunteers for the next quarter through the end of December. If you have questions, please contact Pastor Martha.

Additional History of Grace Lutheran Church

In July 1886, the Westminster Charge, consisting of Grace Church, St. Benjamin's and St John's was divided and The Rev. Dr. Kuhns was elected pastor of Grace Church at a salary of \$800. He served the Westminster Charge and Grace Church for a total of nine years and resigned on August 29, 1887. He preached his farewell sermon on October 23, 1887.

On October 20, 1887, The Rev. Patrick Henry Miller accepted the congregation's call. Pastor Miller's first two sermons were delivered on November 20, 1887. The 10:30am subject was "Preach the Word" and the evening message was "Know the Ministry." Pastor Miller was installed pastor of Grace Church on January 29, 1888. At this time, the congregation numbered 140 communicant members.

During Pastor Miller's pastorate, the envelope system was adopted, the pipe organ was installed in June 1892 and the silver jubilee of Grace Church was celebrated June 25-28, 1893. In October 1899, the Maryland Synod met in Grace Church, with Pastor Miller being elected as president.
