Because of Who You Are

A thought came to me this past weekend as I was in the midst of the distribution of Holy Communion. As recipients came forward to receive the Body of Christ from me I was saying the usual and important words, "The Body of Christ given for you." But after each time, a thought in the form of a silent prayer came unbidden to me, "because of who you are." This little prayer followed after each person so that spoken and unspoken together I was in essence saying, "The Body of Christ given for you because of who you are." It happened Saturday night and then again at each of the services on Sunday morning. This wasn't something I was thinking about but it freely came to me each time the Body of Christ was being offered and received. And I wondered what could this mean?

In pondering my newsletter article for this month I had tried to begin several times focusing on the season of Lent or pondering the wondrous celebration of the coming Easter. But each effort fell short and in the vacuum of ideas that prayer would again surface, "The Body of Christ given for you because of who you are."

In Luther's Small Catechism on the subject of Holy Communion the great reformer commented that sharing in this holy meal "we receive forgiveness of sins, life and salvation." Our Lord Jesus instituted this important meal for the people of God knowing full well who we are—sinners. In the sharing of the meal each of us comes to the table of The Lord, not as some righteous and holy person but as a broken sinner in need of God's forgiveness and love. So often people become confused about what it means to be the Church, the body of Christ. Outsiders complain that the church is full of hypocrites. Insiders complain that fellow members don't agree with me on every point and thus must be rejected. But coming to the table of The Lord we are all the same, broken and hurting from our sins and from the sins of others. When we take, eat, and drink we receive the healing love of God and the forgiveness of our sins.

This Holy Meal doesn't seem like much; a simple meal of bread and wine seems so little and insignificant. Father Meletios Webber wrote that the simplicity of the meal is the result of the Son of God coming to us as to not overwhelm or harm us but to heal us and make us whole. Jesus among us; Jesus in us; Jesus coming to us because of who we are; broken and in need of divine love and forgiveness. It is so easy to point a judging finger at others. It is a sobering reality

that each of us needs the presence of Christ who comes to us in our sinfulness and loves us into redemption.

The Body of Christ given to you because you are a lost and broken child of God. You are a child who has failed and you walk among your brothers and sisters who also have failed and fallen short. We come to receive Jesus because of who we are as sinners and for what we need—forgiveness. We return from this sacred encounter as the redeemed children of God prepared to leave the church as the forgiven and empowered people of God. We go out in the world to make Christ's love known because of who we have become.

Prayer

Where/how did you learn to pray? Has your prayer life matured as you've aged? Do you continue to grow in prayer? Have you given up on prayer (intentionally or unintentionally)?

In a recent chapel service with four year old Little Friends of Grace students, I asked the question, "what can we do to show that we are friends and followers of Jesus?" One of the first answers given was, "we can pray." The wisdom of a four year old is worth hearing!

Prayer is a sign of our faith in Jesus Christ. It is a practice that is a very real part of being a Christian. But really, what is prayer????

I've always been intrigued by 1 Thessalonians 5:17 which reads, "pray without ceasing." That never fit well with the kind of prayer I was taught as a child. How could you pray without ceasing when you needed to bow your head, close your eyes, and fold your hands? Besides that I was taught the practice of prayer by people mostly of German heritage who just wanted you to get to the point and not ramble on!!

Thankfully, I've had many prayer-mentors who helped me learn and grow beyond those first brief monologues presented before God. I've come to believe that we all need to begin with bedtime prayers and meal prayers from which we can learn to expand and grow.

Since I have limited space here in the newsletter, I'd like to share just a few of the thoughts I have about prayer. If you'd like to dialogue further on this topic, I welcome your emails, phone calls, and conversations.

First, as we mature in prayer, we need to move beyond presenting God with a wish-list as if God is the great Santa Claus who can deliver the things that would make us happy. While it is true that Jesus encouraged persistence in approaching God (see Luke 11:5-13), Jesus modeled for us the practice of saying, "yet, not my will, but thy will be done." (see Luke 22:42). Prayer ought to shape us into the people that God would have us be. We aren't convincing God to do it our way, but we are seeking to become more and more what God would have us be.

Secondly, while there is no one "correct" way to pray, prayer does take intentionality. We need space, quiet, and time to truly experience the give and take of communicating with God. Prayer without ceasing begins and is continually nurtured by intentional times of knowing we are in God's presence and that the Holy Spirit is shaping who we are. From there, we can experience what it means to live a life of prayer, moving and living so close to Christ that we are continually in prayer.

Finally, as we grow in our prayer life, we come to realize that prayer is not an individual activity. It isn't about getting your way or being noticed by the Almighty. Rather, prayer is a communal activity in which God's people care for one another, connect with the world around us, and strengthen our relationship with God, our Creator and Redeemer. Prayers of intercession for others take on more and more weight and time while the knowledge that others are praying for us supports and encourages us more than we can say.

One of my favorite evening hymns includes a beautiful image of prayer happening all over the world. Two of the verses say:

As to each continent and island
The dawn leads on another day,
The voice of prayer is never silent,
Nor dies the strain of praise away.
The sun, here having set,

is waking your children under western skies, and hour by hour, as day is breaking, fresh hymns (prayers) of thankful praise arise.

The weeks of Lent provide a great opportunity to renew our commitment to prayer by setting aside a bit more time to be open to the Spirit of God. Join the people of God around the world in speaking and in listening, for God promises to hear and answer our prayers.

Paper Recycling

Did you know that money earned by paper recycling at Grace goes directly to support Carroll Lutheran School?

There are two paper recycling bins in the back parking lot to receive newspapers and paper (shredded paper in plastic bags is welcome too). (This company does not want cardboard.)

We have been a site for recycling since 2009. The amount of paper collected and money earned has dropped off in the last year....in 2010, we collected 34.34 tons making \$312.30, while in 2012 we collected 21.50 tons making \$107.55. No doubt the new recycling containers distributed in the Westminster area have had an impact on our collections.

If you are able to drop off your newspapers and other paper recycling when coming to church, it will be greatly appreciated by our partner in ministry, Carroll Lutheran School.

Holy Week and Easter Schedule

We continue to observe the season of Lent each weekend throughout the month of March. Midweek Worship Services on Wednesday evenings help us grow more deeply in our relationship with Christ. Soup Suppers are offered at 6:00 followed by worship services at 7:00 on March 6, 13 & 20.

Sunday, March 24 – On Saturday evening (5:00) and Sunday morning (7:45, 9:00 and 11:15) we celebrate Palm Sunday, Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem and prepare for the events of the week by observing Passion Sunday as well. First Communion will be celebrated by a number of our children during these worship services.
