Not Just Ancient History

As I write this article, many eyes are on Rome....the Cardinals have just entered the conclave to elect a new pope. By the time you read this article, we will know who is elected. Although as Lutherans and part of the Reformed Tradition of the church, we don't look to the pope as sole leader, we still are interested in the outcome of this election because the leader of the Roman Catholic Church is the most visible leader of Christianity here on earth. What people know about Christianity often is shaped by the tone and direction set by the pope.

What is the church? Does the church have the authority to speak for God? If so, how do we make sense of the reality that the church doesn't always speak with a unified voice?

The best way to address these kinds of questions (which are very relevant today), is to go back to the beginning. The Book of Acts, the companion volume to the Gospel of Luke, tells us about the very beginning of the Christian Church here on earth. It takes us back to the days after Jesus' death, resurrection, and ascension to tell us how Jesus' mission was to continue even in his absence. From these early beginnings come many of our beliefs and practices to this day.

I love how Trinity Lutheran Seminary Professor Mark Allan Powell describes this writing. "The book of Acts has everything but dinosaurs. It's got earthquakes, shipwrecks, avenging angels, harrowing escapes, riots, murder plots, political intrigue, courtroom drama and so much more. The book of Acts tells the story of the early Christian church with all the flair of an exciting adventure novel. Things start out rather calm – constant prayer and some business to attend to—then the Holy Spirit comes roaring into the room, igniting the pious with tongues of fire and causing them to behave in ways that lead onlookers to think they're drunk. From that point on, we know we are in for a bumpy ride." (Introducing the New Testament)

This spring, beginning after Easter and extending just past Pentecost, I will be leading a Bible Study focused on the book of Acts. It is a great time of year to think about the birth of the church, its role in the world, and our participation in it. We will explore topics such as the Holy Spirit, community, idolatry, prayer, justice, salvation and much more!! I invite you to share in this study on six consecutive Wednesday evenings, beginning on April 17. Class will be held from 7:00 - 8:30 p.m. (Unfortunately, due to things already scheduled on week day

mornings, I'm not going to be able to hold a morning class this time around. I really am sorry about that!)

Please consider joining in the study of this exciting part of Scripture. You can register at worship via the RCR card or by emailing me at mclementson@gracelc.org. I would appreciate hearing from you if you plan to attend. If you are not able to attend the study, I encourage you to add the book of Acts to your reading this spring! Acts takes us back to the beginning of what continues to be God's powerful presence in the world today.

Hand Towels in the Offering Plate?!?



The Gospel of Mark tells us that Jesus proclaimed, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand;" In Luke Jesus sends out the 72 with a message "The Kingdom of God has come near you." The Bible is filled with messages that God is very present in our world and in our lives. Should it come as any surprise that in a million different ways God is constantly reaching out to us? On a recent Sunday service the offering was collected and in the offering plate besides the usual offerings of money there came a set of hand towels. As Pastor Martha set the offering plates on the back table I thought it quite odd to see dish towels in the offering plate. I wondered what that was all about. Throughout the creed and the prayers of the Church I continued to wonder about this rather odd contribution. Then it struck me that I was looking at what might best be described as a visual parable. A towel is a sign of service within the Church; a sign of hands-on ministry.

Often faith and ministry are a much more comfortable affair if we can keep it at a distance. Early in my ministry I was involved in the relocation and building of a new church building. Two congregations both located in dying old industrial towns where poverty and decay were transforming the landscape were able to find several acres of ground on the outskirts of town where there were newer homes and we were off the beaten path. Before our move it was a daily occurrence for people in

need to stop at our doors asking for some sort of help; after our move the parade of people was reduced to that odd knock on the door a few times a year. At first it was so much easier to gather in some money and send it off to other churches who continued to meet the needs of the poor and struggling. But soon we began to realize that there was something missing in the life and ministry of the Church; we had ceased to be a servant church.

A very powerful vision of Jesus' ministry takes place when Jesus is with his disciples that last night before his crucifixion. In John's gospel we have the scene where Jesus washes the feet of his disciples. "He laid aside his outer garments, and taking a towel, tied it around his waist. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet." Later on Jesus will say to his disciples, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another." The towel around Jesus waist becomes a powerful symbol of loving service to others. This is the kind of love that occasionally requires us to get our hands dirty.

I think about the image of those hand towels in the offering plate; a sign that we are to not only offer our money to the Lord but we are to also give of ourselves in loving service to others who are in need of God's love. Towels in the plate are a sign from God that he also needs us to give of ourselves to make his love real in the world. Here is a sign that calls us to not only give of our financial resources but to also give of our lives, to step outside of the comfort of our defined lives and embrace a hurting world with the healing love of God.

Towels in the Offering Plate! What calling does this parable of service mean for your life? If you were to tie a towel around your waist what might you be called to do in your life? Towels in the Offering Plate! I wonder if one of them is meant for you?

Paper Recycling

Did you know that money earned by paper recycling at Grace goes directly to support Carroll Lutheran School?

There are two paper recycling bins in the back parking lot to receive newspapers and paper (shredded paper in plastic bags is welcome too). (This company does not want cardboard.)

We have been a site for recycling since 2009. The amount of paper collected and money earned has dropped off in the last year....in 2010, we collected 34.34 tons making \$312.30, while in 2012 we collected 21.50 tons making \$107.55. No doubt the new recycling containers distributed in the Westminster area have had an impact on our collections.

If you are able to drop off your newspapers and other paper recycling when coming to church, it will be greatly appreciated by our partner in ministry, Carroll Lutheran School.

Pot Luck and Song


Spring is right around the corner and that's a sure sign that Pot Luck and Song is returning!!!



The ELCA reported that the malaria death rate is showing signs of slowing, thanks to global efforts, including your contributions. Fewer children are dying of malaria. While still unacceptable, today a child dies every 60 seconds from malaria rather than last year's rate of every 45 seconds or every 30 seconds 2½ years ago. I'll have more information about this as the months go on and how you and I can help.



Not long ago, Luley was a hopeful young bride. She and her husband had two healthy children, and their livestock were doing well. But then the conflict that has driven so many Somali people from their homes overtook this family, too.

Fearing death at the hands of the militiamen who had sought to press him into service, Luley's husband fled their home.

"I may never know if my husband is alive or dead," she says sadly. Soon after her husband left, she and the children had to leave their village, too. "I needed to look for peace for my children and myself."

Luley (pictured with her two children) found the peace she had hoped for in a refugee camp, supported by your gifts through the international work of Lutheran Disaster Response.

When Luley and the children arrived at the refugee camp, they weren't sure where to go. They were placed in temporary housing and given food and water right away. The staff at the refugee camp quickly found a tent for the family.

Luley and her children have a place to call home again. She says that she is adjusting to her new life as a refugee. With the support of her relatives, new neighbors and the gifts of those who responded to our Horn of Africa Relief effort, Luley has hope again.

Phillipy Scholarship Fund

In 2001, Lester N. Phillipy, Jr., a member of Grace, died, and as part of his estate, established the Phillipy Family Scholarship Fund, which can be used to fund one or more full tuition scholarships to an accredited college or university. Active members of Grace are given priority in awarding these scholarships. Recipients are selected by two attorneys in Baltimore who are the Co-Trustees of the Fund. Criteria include financial need, academic standing, and good moral character.
