

Making Plans for Summer

Pastors worry about how to gently remind people to remember the Lord and their brothers and sisters who will miss them in the summer months when they go missing from Church. We pastors also know that when people take off for several weeks or a month or two there is an increased risk that some will never return. Over the years I have pleaded and cajoled hoping to stop the inevitable summer migration and truthfully I haven't been too successful. I have tried to be clever and silly, thoughtful and witty all with little to no results.

Today I will use plain talk in hopes that my point can be made. You are a child of God and all the blessings of your life, all the things that you will enjoy this summer are a direct result of God. Please don't forget to thank the Lord in worship and in your continued stewardship. While you are away the church doors will remain open. In the approximately 12 weeks of summer approximately 2,400 meals will be served at the church to friends and neighbors who are struggling to make ends meet. Youth and adults will go on mission trips. Forty-eight worship services will be planned and celebrated. Vacation Bible Camp and Mar-Lu-Ridge day camp will occur. Building staff will be painting and cleaning; doing projects that have been delayed for summer. Staff will be working hard to plan for the coming program year. The gospel will be proclaimed in deed and word. Your presence in worship and your financial support throughout the summer are important, not only for

you but for your brothers and sisters. So as you make your summer plans how about penciling God in for Saturday night or Sunday morning; it wouldn't hurt you to give God thanks for the joys of the season.

Oh... the cartoon? Well just in case you didn't get around to reading my message I thought I would hedge my bet with a little whimsy. God bless you and I hope to see you this summer.

Why Are We Losing Our Youth?

Many guesses have been made and many books have been written trying to explain why the church no longer includes the majority of teens and young adults in our society. This noticeable trend is having an impact on our society as well as on our church. It is tempting to throw up our hands and say that the problem is beyond our solving, but I for one am not ready to give up.

I recently read a book that I found extremely helpful. "You Lost Me. Why Young Christians Are Leaving Church....And Rethinking Faith" was written by David Kinnaman, President of the Barna Group and reflects on new research done with young adults ages 18 to 29. Immediately, Kinnaman acknowledges that not all young people have the same experience of the church. Many are still involved and committed to faith and to church. Others have drifted away from church for a variety of reasons, yet still hold fast to faith in Christ, or at least "God." Still others have become separated from the church completely, again for a variety of reasons.

What can the church do to address the issues that seem to be troubling to our youth? As the church has tried to address this in the past, common answers have been to create a more entertaining worship style or build up youth groups that are larger and more fun. The Barna research challenges these kinds of attempts, finding that it isn't entertainment or "big" that young people are looking for....at least that's not what will keep them connected to church in the long run. Instead, the question is one of **relationship** with God and with others in the church. It is a question of whether we engage in conversation and exploration with our youth....do we allow them to ask questions, even of God? And it is a question of whether we prepare our youth to understand how to take faith into life.... for instance, what does my faith have to do with my choice of a career? Now, these aren't meant to be easy answers to a very complex and troubling situation, but they do help us understand what parents, faithful Christian leaders, and congregations

might begin to address in order to keep our youth more fully connected to the church in the future.

"You Lost Me..." contains such important insights that I'd love for many of you to read the book and discuss it so that we can go much deeper than reading an article in the newsletter. Parents of children and teens would benefit greatly by reading this book. The young adults and older adults would benefit from reading it. And of course, those people who are striving to provide good Christian Education and Youth Ministry in our congregation would really benefit from studying the content of this book. Really, anyone who cares about young people and the future of the church would find the book and conversation about it to be worthwhile.

Pastor Kevin, Leanne, and I would like to invite you into a conversation about how we might better support our youth and young adults. This summer, would you take time to read "You Lost Me..." and then spend a few hours in conversation with us and one another??? If you aren't much of a reader, there is a DVD presentation of the material by the author. During the month of May, we will offer the book (\$13.49) or DVD (\$22.49) for purchase (you can order on your own Kindle \$9.17 and NOOK Books \$8.39) and we will ask through the RCR card at worship for people to indicate their interest in having a conversation. Based on the number of people interested and all of our schedules, we will arrange for time(s) to get together to talk...it might be over breakfast, over Sunday lunch, on someone's deck on a summer evening, etc.

Would you join us in caring deeply about the young people God has placed in our care? Would you pray and think with us about how our congregation can be more supportive of the youth of today so that they will want to stay connected to the body of Christ for their entire lives? I am sure that you will find it to be time well spent! We look forward to hearing from you.

Gifts totaling \$13,144.05 were transferred to the Mortgage Principal during January 2013. These gifts are not reflected in the above statement as they are going directly to the Mortgage Principal. The Principal balance on the Mortgage as of March 31, 2013 is \$2,029,519.

During March we were also able to transfer \$25,000.00 from our cash account to our investments. March was a very positive month due to Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. At the present time our cash account still has a sufficient amount, even after making the \$25,000.00 transfer. Our year-to-date expenditures for the first quarter are below budget. All our bills are being paid in a timely fashion.

We need to make sure we continue our giving for the remainder of the year.

Grace Lutheran Scholarships

After not being able to give scholarships for a couple of years, we are happy to announce that once again Grace Lutheran Church will award scholarships from the Grace Lutheran Scholarship Fund. Scholarships may be granted to students who are attending college, graduate school, or other schools of higher education. These scholarships are intended for members of Grace Lutheran Church. The amount of the scholarship depends upon the annual availability of interest money in the Scholarship Fund and the number of applicants who receive scholarships. In the past, recipients received between \$500 and \$2,000.

The following process and timeline will be followed:

Application forms are available from the church office (will be emailed to you) and on the church website (www.gracelc.org) beginning April 26.

Applications are to be returned via email to <u>dstem@gracelc.org</u> between May 1 and May 31. No applications will be received after May 31.

The Scholarship Committee will review the applications and make decisions during June and July. Students may be asked to meet with the committee for a personal interview.

Applicants will receive a decision by August 1.

Please have all donations in by May 12.


Church Women United

Could a Legacy Gift Hurt My Family?

For those of us with families, our first impulse may be that a large gift to the church could have a negative impact on our loved ones. Would we be taking money out of the hands of our children and grandchildren, and deprive them of much needed resources?

Before we put the church in our Will we gave this some thought and came to the following conclusion: we have been giving to the church for many years and our children have done just fine. In fact, they have certainly benefited from our long association with Grace.

Then we did some math. If we leave a hypothetical estate of \$100,000 and provide 10% of it to go to the church, then Grace would receive \$10,000 and each of our daughters would get \$45,000. That is still a lot of money and not much different from what they would have gotten otherwise.

We should not feel that legacy giving is an all or nothing proposition. There is plenty of room to provide for our families and also leave a portion for our church. We strongly urge you to consider this approach.

Quiet Evenings Program

WHAT: Quiet Evenings: Sanctuary, Reflection, Spiritual Practice--"Walking the Labyrinth"

WHEN: Friday, June 7, 6:30-8:30 pm WHERE: Grace Lutheran Church

WHO: Quiet Evenings are for anyone who wants to step away from the busyness of their life and be present with God. **WHY:** To listen and respond authentically to God's calling in your life away from life's distractions and interruptions.

When was the last time you allowed yourself even a moment of quiet? Our days, especially with the emergence of the beautiful weather, are filled with the busyness of life, running here and there to appointments, events, games, and just "doing" in general. During this Spring-to-Summer season, we invite you to give yourself permission to let go of your responsibilities for a few hours, step outside the busyness of your life and be present with God in the moment, and listen and respond authentically to God's calling in your life. Quiet Evenings begin with a time of entering into a space with quiet music to join one another in a quiet gathering and letting go of the busyness of the day.

Join us on June 7 as we "Walk the Labyrinth" in Grace Hall. Walking the labyrinth is a way of fully engaging the body in prayer and inviting a quiet time with The Holy One – there is no right or wrong way to walk a labyrinth. The labyrinth we will have in Grace Hall is a canvas replica that is in the floor of the nave at Chartres Cathedral in France. There will be ample time after for quiet reflection, journaling, an optional time of sharing, and a brief service of prayer to close our evening of quiet.

Additionally, you will receive more information by email when you register to attend.
