Finding Peace on Earth

As we approach the Thanksgiving – Christmas Season, we begin to hear those greetings and songs that wish for "Peace on earth." It is certainly a worthy goal to find peace on earth, yet we all know how elusive that goal has been throughout the generations.

Helen Englar, a member of Grace and a retired elementary school teacher tells a wonderful story about two boys who were reported to be fighting on the playground. Helen called the boys over to ask what happened. Each was eager to tell his side of the story. "One at a time; I will hear from you both," she said. The first boy she called on spoke boldly, "he hit me back first!" Helen scratched her head and said to the boy, "Let me see if I heard you correctly. He hit you back first?" "Yes," the boy answered, "if he would not have hit me back, there would not have been a fight."

Isn't that a wonderful story? It expresses so well why peace on earth is difficult to come by. Most of us sincerely believe that we are on the side of peace and it's those other people who are causing the strife.

Jesus said, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called the children of God." (Matthew 5:9) Jesus also said, "I have not come to bring peace but a sword..." (Matthew 10:34-39) But notice, Jesus doesn't stop there. He goes on to say that he has come to call us to follow him in the way of the cross where we give up our lives for the sake of others. Jesus isn't referring to a sword that will get rid of the enemy. Instead, Jesus' sword marks the division that comes when one gives one's life away for the sake of others. It isn't always a popular decision to live for the sake of others. In fact, it can stir up unhappiness in some of our closest relationships.

It seems to me that we will never accomplish "peace on earth" until we find peace in our own homes and communities and most especially until we find peace in our hearts. The peace that Jesus offers is a contentment that calms our anxieties and concerns in the midst of any and all circumstances. It isn't outward peace, but inward peace that we need to find first.

Then once we know peace in our own lives we will be eager to share that peace with others. Just a few verses after Jesus talks about bringing a sword, he says this, "...whoever gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones in the name of a disciple—truly I tell you, none of these will lose their reward." (Matthew 10: 42)

I think when I was a child, like most people, the phrase, "peace on earth" immediately stirred up thoughts of places far away...places like Vietnam and South Africa. Now, when I think of "peace on earth" I also think of places much closer to home....the halls of Congress, the streets of Baltimore, and our own homes too often disrupted by violence and fear. It brings a new meaning to being a part of making "peace on earth" a reality. Mother Teresa once said, "If we have no peace, it is because we have forgotten we belong to one another." I would add that peace begins by knowing that we belong to Christ. From there, we are set free to belong to one another.

As we approach the upcoming holidays, I pray that you will take time to allow Christ to firmly plant peace in your heart, no matter what your outward circumstances and challenges might be. I pray too that you will share the Peace of Christ with those around you.



Show Up

In the early 1980's Pastor Martha and I lived in the Beaver Valley, a highly industrialized region known as part of the rust belt. In the height of the American Industrial Revolution this region produced the steel that built our nation. During World War II, plants along the Ohio and Beaver Rivers created the landing boats that would bring troops to the shores of such places as Salerno, Normandy, Iwo Jima, Tarawa and Guadalcanal. The Beaver Valley was long a place of great industry and sacrificial ambition as men and women laid shoulder to the great American industrial engine that produced the resources for a growing nation and handsome financial rewards to those who went into the mills and plants that lined the rivers surrounding Pittsburgh. Then in the early 1980's this great industrial engine began to sputter and in breathtaking fashion the once giant mills that dominated the landscape went silent and soon wrecking balls would lay flat the cathedrals of industry leaving behind toxic wastelands and dying communities. In the horror of the mid-eighties we watched nearly 100,000 flee the region in search of jobs and a new life.

The congregations of every denomination in that time began to suffer greatly as members left the region. The once filled churches were emptied of all but the elderly, the weak and the few who were fortunate enough to have found employment. One of the greatest lessons learned during this time was that the remaining members discovered just how important they were to each other for mutual support and loving care of each other. In time of great social change members of the body of Christ coming together in prayer and worship became an important weekly event. One could reasonably argue that they personally didn't need to be in Church every week, but attendance was important for the sake of others. To see and be seen in the context of Christian Community is an extremely important ministry for the sake others. People would ask, what can I do to make a difference? The answer is pretty simple; show up.

In our current day I see some very similar tendencies as we see our world going through radical social change. Technology has changed the landscape of our lives as we lose ourselves tumbling into the small screens of our e-tablets, smartphones and laptops. Relationships are neglected; just go to a restaurant and watch people at a table each lost in their own digital world. We have become a world that demands to be fully entertained in every moment of every day. We abandon communities and families in search of that which will hold our personal attention. I am reminded once again of the 100,000 who left the Beaver Valley, only now people are leaving each other by simply focusing in on those silly devices.

Churches throughout the world are suffering as people disconnect from community or at least disconnect from communities that don't meet their hunger for digital and electronic media stimulation. The handshake, the hug and the consolation of the generations has been bargained away for the hype and swag of the new and the inventive.

Is it true that we have given up being the body of Christ for the sake of the baubles of technology? Have we decided that it is easier to start over someplace else rather than find the ways of overcoming the wounds and indiscretions of the past? We abandon the old for the new, walking away from the incubators of our faith as if we have no obligation or need to assist with the past and future generations of faith.

The world is changing and truthfully more than ever we need each other. The generations of God's children need each other for insight, wisdom and support. Christ speaks through us all and when we walk away from each other we in essence mute the message of love and support. It is always tempting to declare that some other place better meets our needs. It is harder to accept that the old places of our faith indeed need us, because if we are needed then we have to take on the responsibility to serve and not merely be served.

The world is changing and in these changing times many find themselves lost, alone and shut off from the world. The Church, as the Body of Christ, is a place where we can break the shackles of isolation not only for ourselves but for those around us. How can we accomplish such things? Simple, the first step is in showing up.

Proceeds from the sale of the rental properties have been disbursed as follows: \$201,477.37 from the sale of 20 and 22 Carroll has been transferred to the mortgage principal. \$112,267.43 from the sale of 18 Carroll has been invested short term with \$50,000.00 of the amount allocated for the Sanctuary, and \$62,267.43 set aside to be used for any expenditures that may arise in the refinancing of the mortgage in November 2013. Any excess of the \$62,267.43 will go against the mortgage principal. Our Principal balance as of September 2013 is \$1,793,502.82.

As you can see, we have a deficit for the year thru Sept. 2013 of \$145.932.82. We need to make sure we continue our giving for the remainder of the year
