A Huge Thank You!!

I am writing this article a few days after returning from our trip to Israel. We are not yet back to work, using our last few days to get our feet on the ground, put the rest of the Christmas decorations away, and most of all to readjust the time clock! Being wide awake at 3 a.m. is a bummer! It has been very strange to be away from Grace for three weeks. The trip was enjoyable and the change of pace for this amount of time has been renewing. I want to thank the members of the church council (2013 & 2014) for their encouragement and support for Pastor Kevin and me to undertake this once-in-a-lifetime trip.

Last year, when I taught the Overview of the Bible course, we talked at length about the impact of the people of Israel as they introduced the concept of Monotheism. That lesson came to mind many times as we visited sites in Israel and Jordan. Most ancient people worshipped many gods. But it was Abraham and his descendants who were introduced to the great "I AM." As the people of Israel got to know this God, they introduced Him to their neighbors and enemies alike. Obviously, not everyone came to faith in the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, but many did and this new Monotheism had a great impact on everyone. Generations later, Jesus provided greater insight into who God is and how God desires to live in an active relationship with each of us. Today, there are great struggles throughout the Middle East, many of them due to the fact that while almost all of the people believe in one God, there are three distinct ways of understanding and relating to that God. Certainly, in all of our lives, we continue with the human challenge of keeping God at the center of our lives and not allowing many gods to overtake our time, interest, and commitment.

One of the lasting impressions that will live on for me is the contrast that I experience between visiting ruins of ancient communities and living among the active, dynamic people of God. It was amazing to walk the streets of Nazareth, Bethlehem, and Jerusalem. Standing at Abraham's well, and in the ruins of the cities of Dan and Jericho, and on Mt. Nebo from where Moses looked across the valley to the Promised Land, were all very moving. But now they are just places. While once vibrant places where people lived, worked, and worshipped, now these places are simply attractions for tourists and pilgrims. How much better it is to stand in the midst of God's people who worship, serve, and learn day in and day out. Civilizations come and they go. Great leaders are replaced by the next generation (secular and religious). So it is important to make the most of the time

that we are given here on earth. Now, while it is our watch, we have the opportunity to make a difference as we share the good news that God has come to us in Jesus. Our lives, as fleeting as they may be, can make a huge difference when we touch the lives of others with the peace and compassion of Christ.

I am happy to be home and look forward to continuing our ministry together here at Grace. Thank you for your support and care for your pastors. Let us continue to make a difference by welcoming God's Spirit to work in and through us each and every day.

The Oldest City

An inspiring story and history lesson revolves around the city of Jericho. Most of us know about this city in relationship to the story of the people of God entering the Promised Land and confronting the people of Jericho in a battle where the walls of the city collapsed. Remember the spiritual "Joshua fit de battle of Jericho?" However, it could be argued that this ancient city has collapsed as many as twenty (20) times in 11,000 years and is thus arguably the oldest city in the world. Today a city of nearly 20,000 residents, this ancient city is symbolic of the tenacity of the human spirit. Earthquakes and wars have over and over again leveled the city; yet upon the ruins of the past the city has been rebuilt. When you look at Jericho with a passing glance to rebuilding twenty times it seems as nothing more than an interesting piece of trivia. Yet stand by the uncovered ruins and think upon each of these chapters in the life of the city and you are struck by sorrows of the past and the hope for the future that allowed people to recover and rebuild after each tragic episode. I observed that each successive rebuilding of Jericho often included using the building materials of the past. The stones, columns, pillars and blocks of the past were harvested and used again to construct the next version of the city.

In wandering around the ruins of the ancient city I was reminded that too often in difficult times we can be fooled into thinking that all is lost. Whether we are looking at our personal lives, the life of the Church or the nature of our society, we can be so trapped by endings that we are unable to see the opportunities of new beginnings. Twenty times the city of Jericho has collapsed from one event or another and each time it has been rebuilt. The ruins of the past have served as a fertile resource for the next unfolding version of that city. There is a lesson to be learned for our own lives. When we encounter failure and collapse the perceived ruins before us can serve as building blocks for our future.

When Paul wrote to the Christians in Rome he suggested that nothing can separate us from the love of God and went on to list a host of adversities. This great apostle understood that in Christ every ending is an opportunity for new beginnings. A new year is already unfolding before us and we have an opportunity to build upon the past with a hopeful eye to the future. The successive generations of Grace have bestowed the resources of their faithfulness that have met adversities of fire and changing times. We who live in this age are called to build upon their efforts to meet the needs of our day. What can we bring to the moment of this generation to build up the community and the ministry of Grace? Our brief history, less than 150 years, is nothing compared to the 11,000 year history of Jericho, but the history of this ancient city reminds us that the faithfulness of God is expansive and we must learn to walk in faithfulness trusting in the our Lord's ever present support. Upon our efforts future generations will hopefully continue to build this community of faith. In these changing times let us remember to not lose hope but seek to trust in the Lord knowing full well that he will bless us. Amen

Trivia: Not only is Jericho the oldest city in the world it is also the lowest city in the world at 846 feet below sea level!


Historical Society Box Lunches

HSP's tax preparers are IRS trained and certified. HSP's VITA site will prepare quality tax returns and every taxpayer keeps all of their refund. HSP partners with PNC Bank to bring you FREE debit cards for your refund money or FREE check cashing.

Appointments began on January 21, 2014, and will run through April 15, 2014. Tax preparation hours are Monday and Tuesday 10am-3pm and Wednesday and Thursday 1pm -7pm. 

Financial Report for December, 2013

Our end of the year financial report is still showing a deficit; however due to increased giving in December, we were able to decrease our deficit over what was forecast as of November 30. Even though we wound up with a loss, many good things happened at Grace during 2013.

We were able to sell three rental properties. We received additional gifts from members and also a large gift from an estate. We were able to pay down our mortgage with BB&T and renegotiate and settle on a more favorable mortgage with New Windsor State Bank. We also introduced Our Growth for Ministry Campaign. So far we have 81 families who have made pledges. We have continued with our Legacy Circle of Grace Program. If you need more information on the Legacy Circle of Grace, see Ed Leister.

We also have been able to set aside some funds in a money market at New Windsor State Bank. These funds were from gifts and designated for Sanctuary repairs or debt reduction.

The renegotiation of our mortgage is not the end all answer to our problems. In order to fund our budget for 2014, our giving must increase. We also need to build up our investments which have been continually decreasing over the years in order to fund our mortgage. We also have some major capital improvements that we need to meet in 2014, specifically major renovations to the sanctuary which is part of the Growth for Ministry Campaign, and the boiler conversion and oil tank removable which is in the 2014 budget.

On behalf of the Pastors, Congregational Council and myself, we want to thank the congregation for their continued financial support during 2013. Without this support the ministries of Grace would not exist.
