The Soft Whisper

One of my favorite stories of the Bible is the Prophet Elijah on Mount Horeb. In the 19th Chapter of 1 Kings as despondent Elijah has all but given up; lamenting to God Elijah cries out, "I have been very zealous for the Lord, the God of hosts; for the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away." In response to this lament the Lord says to Elijah, (Think James Earl Jones as your read) "Go out and stand on the mountain before the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by!" One would expect at this point God would display his mighty power to bolster the flagging prophet but this is not the case. "Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the Lord." This would be a good display to support the prophet but read on... "but the Lord was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake." Okay that should be a good display of power. "But the Lord was not in the earthquake; and after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire." Note the display of the mighty powers of the ancient world and God was not found in any of those things. Then we read in verse 12, "after the fire the sound of sheer silence." The New English Translation reads, "After the fire there was a soft whisper." And it was in this moment that the prophet Elijah found himself in the presence of God.

It is the nature of the Lord to come in unexpected ways. Throughout my life I have always been concerned when people of faith insist that everyone experience God in the same way. But this is not the case in the history of the people of God. Moses had his burning bush. Jacob wrestled with God at the River Jabbok. Peter was called by Jesus on the shores of the Sea of Galilee. Paul was struck blind on the road to Damascus. Luther's life altering moment came in the midst of a lightning storm. One moment came for me while leaning on Dad's 1964 International Harvester pickup talking with my pastor. I suspect that you can add your own example of a moment when God has come into your life.

The religion of Faith often tries to suggest limits as to how God can come to us. I am not suggesting that God cannot come to us in the context of worship. In fact I firmly believe that the Lord does indeed come to us when we gather as the body of Christ. In fact I would suggest that we need to keep an open mind to those worshipful moments found in the midst of praise songs and in the melody and

lyrics of ancient hymns. I am disturbed when I hear criticism of boring old worship and with boring old hymns countered with attacks on seven/eleven songs. (These are the songs that have seven words and are sung eleven times.) We speak such language and we close ourselves off to avenues by which indeed our Lord does come to us.

Perhaps the thing that worries me most is that so many people have become so distracted by life that they are no longer paying attention. In our noise-filled world how many miss the soft whisper; the sheer silence of God? I was an attendee at a recent worship service in which I was able to sit anonymously in a congregation. During silence for prayer a young adult was busy playing a game on his smartphone and ever so softly you could hear the beeps and tones of the game. The worship leader had invited us to a moment of silence to listen much like Elijah but here was one too distracted to notice the presence of the Lord. I guess by my own argument one could argue that perhaps God can reach out to such a person. However I am inclined to believe that this young person had no sense of the sacred – being so wound up with what was happening on that small screen and blind to the drama of life unfolding in his presence.

What is my point? Simply that our loving God makes every effort to reach out to his children by means that are extraordinary. In ancient and contemporary music, in liturgy, prayer and devotion God comes seeking to touch our lives and invite us into a living relationship that is transformative and life giving. I would hope that we would be a people who pay attention to the host of opportunities by which our Lord speaks. I would hope that we would remember to honor the many ways by which our Lord does indeed speak and not be so quick to judge and dismiss those ways to which we are not accustomed. Rather than assuming that God can come to us in only one way; rather than judging some ways superior to others perhaps we could remember to take the time to listen expectantly for the presence of the Lord who is ever speaking to his children. Making the Most of Lent

The church year provides us with an annual opportunity for reflection, renewal and repentance. That time is called "Lent" and is nearly upon us once again. Lent begins with the observance of Ash Wednesday on Wednesday, March 5. Here at Grace we have worship services at 12:00 noon and 7:00 p.m.

Why is Lent important? There are of course, many answers to this question. I'd like to lift up two particular reasons that I find Lent an important time in my own life.

First, in this busy world it is easier to think about our faith than it is to put it into practice. This is especially true when it comes to participating in spiritual disciplines that support and enrich our walk with Christ. Lent can be a focused six weeks when we make a special commitment to add a practice in our lives that is not usually there...such as participating in Mid-week worship services with our brothers and sisters in Christ, or spending a few minutes in prayer and Bible reading each day, or attending a class, etc. Second, Lent is a time when we focus on Jesus Christ, learning more about who he is and what he reveals to us about God and ourselves. In our world today, even among Christians, there are so many misconceptions and unhelpful ways of viewing faith. Each year, I appreciate the time we spend being reminded of the teachings of Christ, the events of his passion, and his call to us to follow him by taking up our cross in the world.

Here at Grace, we will offer Wednesday evening soup meals and worship services throughout the six weeks of Lent. This year's theme is "Following the Master: Then and Now." By looking at the witness of some of the Biblical characters who were closest to Jesus, we will learn more about what Jesus faced and we will be called to think about our own faith in Jesus. The services are under an hour and include a children's message. As I look back on my own faith formation, I realize that attending midweek Lenten worship services as a child and teenager was a key component in my growth. I still love the quiet contemplation offered in these services. This year, I am going to offer a four week class during Lent. It is titled, "Why? Making Sense of God's Will." It will be held on Sundays, March 16, 23, 30, and April 6 (6:30 – 8:00 p.m.). I invite adults and teens to consider being part of the class. We will explore many of the difficult questions that we all confront, including why there is suffering and uncertainty when we believe that God loves and cares for each of us. Let's talk about some of those unsatisfactory answers that people give and find a solid foundation for handling these issues as we face them in our lives. Lent is arriving rather late this year. So, we will begin to see the signs of spring as we move through these six weeks. How wonderful it would be to commit yourself to a spiritual journey that helps you move from the winter of darkness and despair to a spring of light and hope as Christ bursts through with love and salvation. Please join me in making the most of the weeks that are ahead. I promise that when we arrive at Easter, you will find a deeper meaning and joy if you've walked closely with Jesus through the time of his passion.

Volunteers in Dental Service – El Salvador 2014

Volunteers in Dental Service is an organization comprised of dental professionals and associates from the metro-Baltimore and Atlanta areas. For the past 24 years, they have made an annual one-week trip to a Central American country for the purpose of providing free dental care to both children and adults. Dr. Michael Luzuriaga, a member of our congregation, currently serves as the group's president.

In mid-January, I had the privilege to be a member of their support team and traveled with Mike, his assistant, Kim Reese, and 19 others to Usulatan, El Salvador. In El Salvador, we were assisted by a local Baptist Church and the 20–30 Club, a service organization similar to the Rotary Club. All of our dental equipment and supplies for the trip were packed in suitcases and transported by the members of our group.

In Usulatan, our dental clinic was set-up in the five rooms of the church's day care facility. The rooms were small (16'x20'), had very little or no lighting, and no air conditioning. The front of each room had an open-air wire metal grate on the upper half section. Temperatures would typically reach the low 90's each day. This was the same week that the ten-inch snow fell in Maryland.

Each day a group of local children and adults would walk to our clinic and wait, sometimes for several hours, to be seen by one of the five dentists and two hygienists in our group. It was interesting to see many of the young children dressed in their best clothes for this special occasion. Except for a lunch break, the dental professionals worked continuously throughout each day to provide dental care to as many people as possible. Even without the benefit of x-rays, the dentists completed numerous fillings, extractions, and even a few root canal procedures. Pain relief medication was also provided after the procedures for the people who might need it.

By the end of the week, 633 children and adults had been seen by the dentists and hygienists. Representatives from the Baptist Church and the 20–30 Club expressed their appreciation and gratitude in a special farewell ceremony that was held in the afternoon of our last day there. I was impressed by how well our team worked together, their high level of professionalism, and the spirited camaraderie and friendship among those who have served together on previous trips. Truly the results of their efforts will be seen in the smiles of those who received guality dental care for many future years.




