## **Proclaiming God's Light and Mercy**

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, **in order that you may proclaim** the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.

Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

These wonderful words, from 1 Peter 2:9-10, make the claim that we are who we are because of God's actions. "A chosen race" goes way beyond any human identification of race or ethnicity. We are reminded that who we are comes as a gift from God. It isn't something we've done, but it is God's mighty acts that have brought us through times of trouble. The author of 1 Peter wanted the early Christians to remember that their lives were based upon the mercy and light that they had received from God through Christ Jesus. Notice that this gift of mercy and heritage is given for a purpose. It isn't just to make you feel better about yourself! It is "in order that you may proclaim..."

I've been thinking about the many ways in which we go about proclaiming God's mighty acts (both past and present). Most of us agree that we are not especially strong when it comes to speaking about Jesus and inviting others into a life of faith. Twenty-first century Christians need to work on that. Yet, we do proclaim God's mighty presence and we share God's mercy. Unfortunately, we often discount or dismiss those ways as not important. We need to realize that our witness is important.

You witness to God's grace and mercy when you participate in worship weekly. Your presence in worship on a very regular basis not only heightens your awareness of God's presence in your life, but your presence helps to encourage and sustain the faith of others. You may not even realize that others notice your presence, but they do. It is true, as individuals and as a community, our presence in worship makes a difference.

You witness to Jesus' place in your life when you make a year-round financial commitment to the ministry of the church. To be sure, ministry takes place outside of the church as well and these days we seem to be under constant pressure to give to every worthy organization. Yet, it is our commitment to sustaining and growing our ministry here at Grace that witnesses to God's central place in the world and in our lives. I cannot speak strongly enough of how important it is for all of us to continue faithful giving to our congregation over the summer months.

You witness to God's love for the whole world when you participate in the many ministries carried out by our congregation. Grace Lutheran serves our community by providing weekly meals, opening our doors for shelter in extreme heat, hosting the Red Cross Blood Bank, supporting Shepherd's Staff and other community ministries.

We provide Christian learning opportunities through various youth groups and Vacation Bible School and Little Friends of Grace Christian Preschool. Pastoral care is provided to elderly members of our congregation as well as to those who are ill or in crisis through pastors, Pastoral Care Associates, Stephen Ministers, Eucharistic Ministers, Sonshine Callers and Hospital Callers. These are just a few of the ministries we support in the summer as well as throughout the school year. Most of this work goes on year round. We appreciate the many, many people who volunteer in these ministries. New volunteers are always welcome!

Summer months provide much needed relaxation and change of scenery for many of us. But please remember that your church community continues to do ministry, just as God continues to grant us grace and mercy. Don't neglect to acknowledge God in your life this summer. We need YOU! We need your witness and your proclamation of the mighty acts of God who has redeemed us in Jesus.

## **Telling the Good News**

"There was a time when all the world spoke a single language and used the same words." (Genesis 11:1) These words begin the final story of the creation narrative of Genesis. The Tower of Babel is the compelling and tragic story of a people who sought to become godlike by combining their efforts to build a great city with a soaring tower that would extend into the heavens. "Let us make a name for ourselves." (Genesis 1:4) We know how the story ends with God confusing the language of these arrogant people and scattering them across the face of the earth. The inability of people to communicate with each other is one of the great sorrows of our world. However it doesn't take the excuse of a foreign language to bring about a failure to communicate. Many years.... many, many, many, years ago when in college I spent a weekend on a retreat learning how to communicate with others without using spoken or written worlds. I took two great learnings away from that weekend. One, how much we are able to say to each other without saying a word. Two, how important it is to pay attention to another person when they are trying to tell you something. Communication requires someone to present their idea in a clear and thoughtful fashion and another to listen carefully.

On Pentecost, 50 days after the Passover the disciples were gathered together when the Spirit of God descended upon them and they began to speak in other languages. The disciples spoke in the languages of the people who had gathered in Jerusalem from around the world. But this time there was no confusion for to all the people of the world came a singular message of the story of Jesus of Nazareth who had died on a cross but rose from the dead. The followers of Jesus had been empowered to begin the good work of drawing all people back into the presence of God; to be together in love and fellowship forms a communication that can bridge all language barriers. Pentecost was that moment in time when the Church, the gathered followers of Jesus were given the Holy Spirit to bring back together a humanity long broken by sin. Communicating the good news of Jesus Christ is what all the followers of Jesus are called to do; and we are to communicate this life-giving word and also to listen carefully to the world around us so that we will better speak the message of God's love to the hurt and hunger of those we encounter.

The Church's celebration of Pentecost should be a moment of renewal and refreshment that sends us out into the world to make God's love real! But in reality what follows Pentecost is summer and the season of a million excuses as to why we cannot serve The Lord or attend worship or support the ministries of the Church. Rather than a moment of rejuvenation Pentecost becomes the last hurrah as we enter the summer doldrums. Here is what I am asking of you this summer: take time for God this summer. In the midst of all that you are doing and planning please do not forget that you still are called upon to communicate the love of God to the world by word and deed. Don't let this summer slide by with a host of failed good intentions. The Spirit of God came to bring life and purpose to the Church. As children of God the Holy Spirit also came to bring life and purpose to each of us. So please don't leave God out of your summer. Our broken world needs you and God is calling you to be part of his great work of communicating his love to all who are in need. Amen.

## **Two Scholarships Available for Youth**

Two Scholarships may be applied for by youth who are members of Grace Lutheran Church. **Both have an application deadline of July 1, 2014.** 



The Phillipy Family Scholarship Fund was established in 2001 by the estate of Lester N. Phillipy, Jr., a member of Grace Lutheran Church. The scholarship can be used to fund one or more full tuition scholarships to an accredited college or university. Money from the Fund is available to active members of Lutheran congregations in Carroll and Baltimore County, with first priority given to members of Grace. Scholarship recipients are selected by the Co-Trustees who are attorneys in Baltimore. Criteria used to determine scholarship recipients include financial need, academic standing, and good moral character. Emphasis is given to financial need. **Grace Lutheran Scholarships** are distributed from a restricted fund here at Grace that has been given for the purpose of supporting members of the congregation who are participating in higher education. Recipients may be at a four year college, a community college or a technical school as long as the school is accredited. Active members of Grace are encouraged to apply. The application process includes a written application and a personal interview with the Scholarship Committee. 

## **Historical Society Box Lunches**

The Historical Society of Carroll County (<a href="www.hsccmd.org">www.hsccmd.org</a>) holds monthly Box Lunch Talks (BLT) for the community to attend. These talks are held on the second Tuesday of every month at Grace Lutheran Church in Grace Hall at 12 Noon. (The information below is taken directly from the Historical Society's information brochure.)

The June topic will be "Manufacturing 'Segars' in Manchester." During America's industrial revolution, Manchester nearly fell behind when it failed to land a railroad line. Cigars to the rescue! The smoking of 'segars' was growing popular at the time. Joe Getty will explore Manchester's fascinating cottage industry from the 1880s to the 1930s.

The July topic will be "250 Years of Westminster History." In 1764 William Winchester developed a plan to sell 45 lots along "King Street" on a 16-acre portion of the northern end of "White's level" on the main road to Baltimore Town. The "piece of ground" was to be called "Westminster." Come celebrate the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Westminster with local *Baltimore Sun* history writer Kevin Dayhoff as he traces the storied history of Westminster, the Carroll County seat of government.

Participating is inexpensive and easy! Parking is free on the Carroll Street parking lot. **Please enter the building through Entrance #2 (double glass doors) on Carroll Street.** Attendees are asked to bring their lunch and enjoy a small selection of beverages and dessert. Admission is \$5 for Historical Society members and \$10 for non-members.

It's been about six months since we publicly announced the Growth for Ministry program at Grace. God continues to bless this effort, and we are thankful for everything you have done to support it.

Growth for Ministry is a five-year stewardship campaign to increase overall giving in order to strengthen and sustain our mission and ministries. During the first four months of 2014, we made the following progress:

- Received pledges from 81 families totaling \$440,300 (roughly 54% of our total budget for general giving for 2014).
- Increased overall general giving from January 1 to April 30 by over \$9,000 compared to the same period of time in 2013.
- Paid all four monthly mortgage payments out of our regular annual budget without tapping into our reserves.
- Began work on much needed repairs to our facility including extensive repairs to the Sanctuary ceiling and the roofs of the Cloister, Fellowship Hall, and Sanctuary.
- Engaged more than 70 people in the Adult Lenten Study of the Adam Hamilton book, Why?: Making Sense of God's Will.
- Launched T.E.C.T. (Teens Experiencing Christ Together), a twice monthly Bible study led by Leanne Elliott, Director of Christian Education, Youth & Family Ministries.
- Initiated an email prayer chain involving more than 30 people and a prayer partners program among Council members.

Everything we have is a gift from God and we are entrusted with the responsibility of using our resources to carry out God's work in our community. While all of these signs of progress are encouraging, we still have work to do in fulfilling that responsibility. We still face a deficit in our annual budget, albeit a smaller one than what we've experienced in the past. Please continue to keep our community of faith in prayer and consider ways you can get involved in the ministries of Grace.

#### **Sanctuary Pew Cushions**

Although new pew cushions are not a part of the renovation project, the Traditional Worship and Music Committee has taken on the responsibility of overseeing the replacement of the pew cushions. Details are currently being worked on. At this point, it looks like the cost of the total project will be approximately \$10,000 for the custom made cushions on 27 pews and chancel chairs. Cushions for one pew will cost approximately \$400. Your help in accomplishing this task will be greatly appreciated. Please watch Weekly Announcements for more information.

## Financial Report for April, 2014

Our end of year financial report for 2013 ended with a deficit of \$136,691. This is prior to any adjustments that the auditors may make in their review which begins this month.

However many good things happened in 2013 such as the sales of three rental properties. We were able to renegotiate and settle on a more favorable mortgage with New Windsor State Bank. We also introduced our Growth for Ministry Campaign. We have been able to set aside some funds for the sanctuary and roof repairs. We are in the process of moving our investments to Passive Capital Management LLC which is located in Lutherville. Passive has ties to many Churches in the area and also does the investments for the Delaware/Maryland Synod.

As of April 30, we are showing a loss in the first 4 months of \$14,348. This is much better then the first four months of 2013, when we showed a loss of \$55,822. Of most importance is that our mortgage payments of \$10,953 monthly are all coming out of our operating fund and not the investments. During 2013 and prior years, our mortgage payments were all coming out of our investments.

We need to make sure that as a congregation, we continue our giving for the remainder of 2014 and especially during the summer months. Our giving tends to drop off during the summer. If you are away, you can continue your giving by using "Simply Giving" on the Grace web page or scan the QR code below.

Thank you for your support and prayers as we move forward during this year, especially with all the projects, such as roof repairs, Sanctuary repairs, and boiler replacement that we will be involved with as a congregation. This is a very crucial time.

"But just as you excel in everything ... in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in your love for us ... see that you also excel in this grace of giving." **2 Corinthians 8:7** In His Service,


