A Matter of Perspective

In the process of selecting a new king to replace King Saul, the prophet Samuel looked at Jesse's oldest son, Eliab and thought that he was surely the one who would be the next king. But God told Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his statue, because I have rejected him; for the Lord does not see as mortals see; they look on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart." (1 Samuel 15:7) After meeting seven of Jesse's sons, it was finally, David, the youngest son, a shepherd, who God anointed to be king. Which brother had the makings of a great king? It was a matter of perspective!

We all look at the world and the events around us "from our own perspective." One's perspective develops out of our own personal experiences, especially the things that we are taught as we grow up. Our experiences as adults also influence how we see the world.

Scripture reminds us that the Lord's perspective is often different from human perspectives and so a large part of our faith journey in life is reshaping our own desires and our own judgments to fit more closely to God's perspective. There are many issues in our world with no clear cut answer. Many of those issues are so complex that there is no way to clearly know what God's judgment might be. And so, as disciples of Jesus Christ, it is up to us to learn, pray, converse, grow and do the very best we can to be faithful to what we do know about God's will.

This year, the Adult Education is offering three forums to help us learn more about important issues in our world. You can read more about them in this newsletter. For now, I want to mention these issues as examples of complex questions that we will do well as Jesus' followers to learn more so that our actions will please our Lord. How do we respond to homelessness in our own community? What can we do to help prevent homelessness? How might we do something to address issues that seem so large, like violence and human trafficking? What difference can we make as we use the resources of the world that God has created?

In "Bread & Wine," the book being read in our Thursday Evening Book Club this fall, author Shauna Niequist, writes, "Sometimes people ask me why I travel so much, and specifically why we travel with Henry so often...I want my kids to learn firsthand and up close that different isn't bad, but instead that different is exciting and wonderful and worth taking the time to understand. I want them to see themselves as bit players in a huge, sweeping, beautiful play, not as the main characters in the drama of our living room."

A few weeks ago, Pastor Kevin and I saw the movie, "The 100 Foot Journey." Although it is probably out of the theaters by now, I urge you to see this movie on DVD or rental. It tells the story of two restaurant owners, from very different cultures, who after much strife, learn to appreciate one another. It is a wonderful story and a great example of how

human beings live with very different perspectives. By getting to know one another, our perspectives broaden and change.

I think that all of us would do well to broaden our perspective. Traveling, reading, meeting new people, conversing with someone who isn't just like you, and watching a new movie, are just a few of the ways in which an individual perspective begins to take in new thoughts and see things from new vantage points. Scripture is a powerful tool that God has provided to lift us from our own little world to see things in a new way, and yes, especially to see things from God's point of view.

May the Holy Spirit continue to push each of us into a new appreciation of our role in this wonderful, diverse, huge world created by God. May we be eager to grow, learn and be refined into the people God needs us to be.

Choices

The season of Fall has arrived and one of the annual rituals of this season is that many young adults transition from high school to college, trade schools or into the world of employment. This is a horizon moment in most people's lives; a moment when you have opportunity to look forward and imagine your future.

A question I ask of the college bound is simply "what is your major?" Answers are all over the place from those with the laser sharp answers of those with well-set sights to the vague shrug of the clueless. I enjoy asking this question and then watching the lives of these young people unfold most often in incredibly unexpected ways. Life has the capacity for redirecting or trumping the plans we set for ourselves. It is rare to find people who have held one clear vision for their life from start to finish.

I suspect that most people will have several of those horizon moments in life when we have opportunity to make choices that impact our futures. In those moments we have to consider many factors that are often dictated by the needs of the moment: economics, necessary skills, time, location, personal and family responsibilities. There are so many things to consider when making a change or redirecting the course of our lives. I fear that one aspect often overlooked is where we see our faith life being lived out in the midst of the choices we make for our future. A career choice that seems so exciting but leaves no time for a relationship with your family or a relationship with God may not be a wise choice. How sad it is when choices are made that in the end leave all of life in ruin.

The consideration of faith is seldom about what I can or cannot do. Rather it is the question of how will I be able to live out my faith in the midst of this path? I recall an individual who worked happily for a corporation for many years. When the company was sold, he found himself working under a management style that wanted him to alter production numbers in order to boost its stock prices. In the end, ethics driven by faith brought him to the place where he had to leave

the company and a long-held career. I have watched many people fall away from Church and their relationship with God because they made choices that gave no consideration of their faith lives.

Such choices also matter in regards to the utilization of our worldly resources. We take on all sorts of financial responsibilities; sometimes stretching beyond the limits of what we can reasonably afford doing, with no consideration to how this will impact our support for the ministries of the Church or other benevolences that are dependent upon donations. Our homes and lives are filled with gadgets, gizmos and all sorts of needless things that have consumed our resources and left little or nothing for God. The lack of resources to share with God is not the result of conscious decisions against The Lord; it is the result of forgetting to consider God at all.

God and a life of faith are not to be reserved for the spare moments of life. In all the choices we make each and every day these are matters to be considered. In the Clementson household matters of faith have played a key role in choices we have made, not only in the obvious nature of our careers, but in the choices of how we manage our time and our financial resources. What we want, what we need and how we choose to serve the Lord have figured into the purchase of homes, cars and the gadgets and gizmos of life.

Career, family, and all the choices we make each day are best served when we remember to consider our relationship with God. It is important for young adults to include God as they make their first moves toward their future. At any point of life when choices are to be made we must remember to keep God central in our thinking. With all the surprises and changes that occur in life, it is comforting to know that God can be the one constant that will make sense of it all.





Historical Society Box Lunches



The Historical Society of Carroll County (www.hsccmd.org) holds monthly Box Lunch Talks (BLT) for the community to attend. These talks are held on the second Tuesday of every month at Grace Lutheran Church in Grace Hall at 12 Noon. (The information below is taken directly from the Historical Society's information brochure.)

The October topic will be "Carroll County's Historic Almshouse." The earliest almshouses in Maryland were established in colonial times. As each new Maryland county came into existence, it was required to open an almshouse. Joanna Peregoy, a volunteer at the Carroll County Farm Museum, explores the history of Carroll County's facility—from its construction in 1852 to its

conversion to a museum over 100 years later.

Participating is inexpensive and easy! Parking is free on the Carroll Street parking lot. **Please enter the building through Entrance #2 (double glass doors) on Carroll Street.** Attendees are asked to bring their lunch and enjoy a small selection of beverages and dessert. Admission is \$5 for Historical Society members and \$10 for non-members.

Topic: Responding to Homelessness in Our Community

NEEDED: Cold Weather Shelter Volunteers

Jesus said, "Feed my Sheep." We can obey this instruction from Jesus by serving the homeless in our community at the Cold Weather Shelter. The Shelter is open November 15—March 31 from 7:00pm to 7:00am to allow those in need a warm place to sleep and a hot meal. We divide the cooking and serving for the Shelter to allow people who would normally not be able to volunteer because of work or other commitments to become active with those in need.



The great thing about volunteering to serve the homeless through the Cold Weather Shelter is there are many opportunities to make a difference.

- 1-**Cook Casseroles**-This involves cooking casseroles that freeze well to be served at the shelter. It is done at home and on your own time. With supervision, cooking can be a service project for school age children.
- 2-Serve Dinner at the Shelter-This involves heating the premade casseroles at the church and then transporting them to the shelter to serve the evening's guest. The time commitment for this is roughly 4:30-7:30/8:00. You must be over 18. This is done on a rotating schedule so you will not be committed to every Saturday.

If you cannot commit to one of these opportunities, we can always use supplies. Our needs are: Progressive Soups (Chicken Noodle, Tomato, and Vegetable), crackers and gallon jugs of iced tea and lemonade. You may purchase these at any time and put them in the kitchen with the label CWS.


