Words That Last Forever

There is power in words; as Christians we acknowledge God who by a word created the heavens and the earth. We understand that throughout the history of humankind this same God has spoken through patriarchs and prophets expressing a message of his love and concern. The writer of Hebrews in his introduction declares; "Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by the Son." (Hebrews 1:1-2a) Throughout the generations Christian have heard the life-giving words of God revealed in the powerful words and actions of Jesus. Jesus is indeed the Word of God. The author of the Gospel of John declares "...the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory..." (John 1:14) Therefore the words of Jesus Christ open a window into God's will for us and all creation.

Ash Wednesday is February 18 and with that solemn celebration we enter into the reflective season of Lent. This is a time for us to consider deeply God's will for his creation and to think carefully about our place as individuals and as a community of faith in the midst of God's creation. In the weeks following Ash Wednesday you are invited on a Lenten pilgrimage in which we will examine the words of Jesus spoken from the Cross. The crucifixion is this great moment in time when God, through Christ, revealed the extent of his Divine love. The ancient Church has often referred to the gospels' collection of words spoken by Jesus from the cross as "The Seven Last Words." They are words that reveal the extent of Jesus suffering, but even more so his overwhelming love and concern for all people.

In a series entitled "Words That Last Forever" we hear many voices reflect upon these powerful words of Jesus. The Wednesday night services will include messages for both young and old. The worship of Evening Prayer will provide a quiet and meditative time in which we can find the spiritual space to allow God's word to enrich our lives. This Lenten pilgrimage is offered to help prepare us for the great celebration of Easter.

Each evening during Lent, prior to the worship service, a simple soup supper will be offered in the Fellowship Hall starting at 6:00 pm and concluding in time for all to attend worship. Please come and bring others with you so that we might journey together while reflecting upon the words of Jesus... **Words That Last Forever**.

You are Invited To Join the Conversation About Baptism and Communion

March 1, 8, 15 3:00 – 5:00 PM

Who is invited to join in the Lord's Table? This has been a question that has been before the church for many generations. However, the question tends to take different shapes from time to time.

When I was in high school I was invited to serve on a study team in my home congregation as we participated in a denomination-wide study of how old one should be before participating in the Lord's Supper. We focused on the preparation needed before participating in Holy Communion. [As a side note, I believe that the invitation to serve on this study team was an important step in helping me see myself as a future leader in the church. We should never overlook those kinds of opportunities for teens and young adults in our congregation.]

Another angle to the question of who is invited to the Lord's Table has had to do with denominational boundaries. Can people who aren't Lutheran join us at the Lord's Table? As you know, the ELCA Lutherans welcome others to share in God's meal with us.

As the Lutheran church continues to become a more diverse church body and as our world continues to be more diversified, a new question has arisen. Now the question is being asked, "Do you need to be baptized before you can share in the Lord's Supper?" When I was on that study team back in the early 1970's, no one was thinking about that question! We were focused on our own children and looking for the best way to continue to engage our own offspring in the mission of the church.

Today, as we seek to reach out into the world to invite people who are not traditionally "churched" we need to ask this kind of question about our Eucharistic hospitality and our practices of welcoming people into the Body of Christ. The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America has a document called, "The Use of the Means of Grace" which guides our faith and practices surrounding the sharing of God's word and sacraments. At this time, the ELCA is using this document to open the conversation about our practices surrounding Baptism and Holy Communion.

Pastor Kevin and I are inviting members and friends of Grace to take a look at these important issues. It will be a time of learning and discussion for us as individuals, for us as a congregation, and for us as part of the wider church body. Those who participate will provide feedback to the ELCA so that our voices will be heard in this study process.

We invite interested persons to gather with us on three Sunday afternoons during March (8, 15 and 22) from 3:00 – 5:00 p.m. In the first session Pastor Kevin and I will lay a foundation by highlighting the Lutheran understanding of the Means of Grace (word and sacraments: Baptism and Holy Communion). In the other sessions, we will delve into practical implications of how we can be wise stewards of these precious gifts from God in a world of diversity and secularization. We hope that people who are new to Lutheranism will join in the converstation....as well as people who have been long time Lutherans. We hope that young people, older people and lots of people in between will be part of the conversation. The more voices we have, the more interesting and helpful our conversations will be. Please join us!!!

Shepherd's Staff Blessings Closet Donations



During the month of February, the Social Ministry Committee is collecting items for The Shepherd's Staff Blessings Closet. Through the years, the Blessings Closet has helped families, seniors, disabled persons, single parents, homeless adults, and out of work individuals. Approximately 2,500 households are helped each year by the Shepherd's Staff.

The following items are needed: Disposable Diapers and Pull-Ups (all sizes), Baby Care Items, Depends, Attends, etc. (all sizes), Shampoo and Conditioner, Paper Towels, Napkins, Facial Tissues, Toilet Tissue, Powder Laundry Detergent, All Purpose Cleaners, Feminine Supplies, Men's Toiletries, Dishwashing Liquid Soap, Trash Bags, Baggies and Foil, Soap, Toothbrush and Toothpaste, Shampoo, First Aid Products, Combs, Brushes and Washcloths. If you need it, someone else probably needs it too!!

These items may be dropped off in the Upper or Lower Gathering Space in the designated boxes throughout the month of February. We thank you in advance for helping with this important ministry in our community.

Adult Forum – Sunday, February 15 at 10:15 in Grace Hall

The second in a series of three Adult Forums will be held on February 15 during the Education Hour. The focus will be "Responding to Sexual Violence Near and Far." Emily Esworthy, a staff member at IMA World Health based out of New Windsor and Brandy Day, the therapist at The Rape Crisis Center in Westminster will share information and insights from their work. The third forum will take place on Sunday, April 19 focusing on "Christian Stewardship of the Environment" and the Rev. Dr. Gilson Waldkoenig, a faculty member at Gettysburg Seminary, will be our guest presenter.




Lent and Easter are coming up fast this year! All of our vocal and instrumental ensembles are starting rehearsals for the many events in the next few months.

Most of you remember I came to GLC a couple of years ago to help continue your efforts in feeding those that may not have the necessities in life to feed themselves as often as they should. I'll be the first to admit we have gotten a little side tracked once in a while with other things like those pesky mosquitoes and how much others eat. GLC has been a leader now for several years and recognized for your labors by the community, other churches, various individuals and the Lutheran Synod.

Through your efforts of sharing food donations, extra dollars, your personal garden extras and your time, many people, both locally and around the world, have been served a meal or received tools with which to do some farming of their own. What was it, feed someone a fish or teach them how to fish or something like that? Your efforts, although not often seen by you, do pay off. There were over 10,000 meals served last year at GLC and extras went out from here to feed others through Shepherds Staff and New Life for Girls. You may think we are done but sadly we're not. Although your immediate neighbor is probably better off than the average population, the world, being the world as it is, still has way too many starving children and adults.

Hunger isn't a funny thing or something to be taken lightly. Just south of us in Central America, 2.5 million people are suffering through the region's worst dry spell in 30 years. Lutheran Disaster Response is working with The Lutheran World Federation to bring relief and new practices to the people.

How can you help you may ask; it's very simple and, maybe too simple. Begin about knee high off the floor and pray for help for those individuals and answers as to how you can. There is always the monthly envelope each for ELCA World Hunger. Equal Exchange items are sold each month in the Lower Gathering Space. You can always give Heifer donations for animals, fowls, and all sorts of things to get families and communities off on a better footing. Well, what do think, ready to get started with the first step?






Boomers Crab Fest

Dear Friends at Grace Lutheran,

Thank you so much for the most generous donation of 27 gift boxes for the Baltimore International Seafarers' Center's Christmas at Sea 2014 program. Many of the seafarers we meet spend only one Christmas in seven with their families, so gifts such as yours are welcome reminders that someone cares about them and appreciates what they do on our behalf. This year especially, many are worried about violent storms at sea or back home, financial struggles, and the threat of piracy. We appreciate your help as we work to brighten their lives.

As you know, the Baltimore International Seafarers' Center offers pastoral care, hospitality, advocacy when appropriate, transportation, communication, and recreation services to seafarers on ships calling at the Port of Baltimore. Life on commercial ships can be painfully lonely. Crews are at sea for weeks at a time with no communications with family and home. Many crew members are away from home for nine months or more, often with no shore leave in the United States. The Baltimore International Seafarers' Center in Locust Point provides a place to relax, telephone and Internet access, free clothing and transportation. We do whatever we can to enable these men and women to keep in touch with their families and loved ones at home.

The Baltimore International Seafarers' Center is an independent non-profit corporation which depends upon contributions and other donations to fulfill its mission. The Center is recognized by the IRS as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, and all contributions are deductible in accordance with law. The Center files IRS form 990, which is available for inspection at the Center or at www.guidestar.org. All contributions help us to serve seafarers visiting the Port of Baltimore.

Again, we deeply appreciate your helping us in this important ministry. Please keep seafarers in your prayers.

Ash Wednesday - February 18

The annual observance of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday when we remember that as humans we are vulnerable and must rely on the love and mercy of God. Our worship includes receiving ashes, reminding us that our lives are in God's hands and Holy Communion, assuring us that in Christ, God continues to nurture and sustain us every day of our lives. Two worship opportunities are offered that day: 12:00 noon and 7:00 p.m.



Soup is offered on Ash Wednesday from 11:30 – 1:30 pm and 4:30 – 6:30 pm (last seating will be 6:30; carry out is available). The menu includes Soup, Bread and Crackers and Drinks. Suggested donation: Adults \$6; Children 5-12 – \$3; Children under 5 – free. Advanced tickets are not needed.




