The Holy Spirit is Here Among Us!!!

Shine, Jesus, shine, fill this land with the Father's glory Blaze, Spirit, blaze, set our hearts on fire. Flow, river, flow, flood the nations with grace and mercy; Send forth your Word, Lord, and let there be light. ©



These words are the chorus of one of my favorite modern hymns. The words come to my mind as I think about the importance of this time in the church year. We have come through Lent, focusing on Jesus' life and death. Now in this Easter season, we celebrate Jesus' resurrection and the opening of the gates of heaven because of Jesus' faithfulness to God's will. Forty days after Easter, May 14, the Church remembers Jesus' return to heaven.

What happens then?? That's when the Holy Spirit arrives!

Exactly when the Holy Spirit came among us is not known....in the Bible, it depends upon which book you are reading. The Gospel of John says that the risen Jesus breathed the Holy Spirit on the disciples the night of his resurrection. Luke, writing the Acts of the Apostles, describes the Holy Spirit coming upon the disciples in Jerusalem after Jesus had returned to the Father. That's what we call Pentecost. Well, the date is more a curiosity question than something we really need to know. Much more important is the question of "why."

"Why" did God, the Father, send God, the Holy Spirit to dwell among us? The simple answer is that like Jesus, the Holy Spirit keeps us connected to God. Another simple answer is that without God's very own power, the disciples (the original ones as well as us) are powerless. Caught up in the sin and temporal nature of this world, we can't do the will of God nor stay focused on the mission of Jesus without God's own help.

So, God comes to us in the Holy Spirit. Fire, power, and light are good words to describe what life can be like when we open our hearts and lives to the flow of God's Spirit! Life in the Spirit certainly isn't dull or boring. It isn't self-contained or isolated. Instead, the Holy Spirit gives us one opportunity after another to go out into the world to make a difference. We are enriched by the sights, sounds, and diversity around us. We are empowered by the confidence that God places in us to get the job done!

I love the church festival of Pentecost. That's the day we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit....in the blazing of fire and the noise of a wind storm, God's presence was made known to the disciples. They spoke languages they had never been taught and were driven out into the streets to talk with strangers about Jesus.

I love Pentecost because it reminds us that the Spirit of God is still at work among us. We are challenged to think about what God's Spirit is doing today with each and every one of us. This year, as in so many other years, Pentecost falls on Memorial Day Weekend. However, if you are not out of town, I urge you to be here at Grace for worship on Pentecost weekend. If you have guests, bring them with you to worship. Don't miss this important reminder that God is at work, here and now, calling us to make a difference for the nations and for our own community and our own families. (Think of this as Christmas for the Holy Spirit!)

I am planning a special event this Pentecost....and to be truthful, I am still working on it. I will be just as surprised as you are to see how it turns out! © Following the leading of the Holy Spirit, we will remember that on that first Pentecost, the Spirit of God brought together people of many languages and before they knew it, they understood each other as they never had before.

We devote ourselves to Christ during the days of Lent and that works well because those days fall on those last awful weeks of winter. Easter raises our spirits when the joy of Jesus' resurrection corresponds with brighter sunshine, lovely spring flowers, and warmer days. But it doesn't end there...God continues to come to us, touch our lives, and call us into action.

Pentecost is coming. May our hearts blaze with the Spirit's presence. May our lives flood the world with grace and mercy that flows from God to us. Join us for a special Pentecost celebration on May 23 (5:00) or May 24 (7:45, 9:00 & 11:15) and see where the Spirit leads us!

Pay Attention

One of the things I so appreciate about spring is the coming of new life, especially after a winter that seemed to never end. In the last couple of weeks I have had opportunity to take some walks through woods and fields and see the bursting forth of new life that had long been dormant through the cold of winter. One day all I saw was the dismal browns and grays of winter and suddenly the bright green of plants pushing their way through the winter thatch. I never tire of seeing this amazing miracle unfold.

Well spring is our easy lesson in discovering the creative power of God in creation. I would like to think that God does this purposefully as a way of encouraging us to look closer at life and discover even more amazing, though perhaps more subtle, ways in which the Divine is being revealed and made known in our world. I love hearing again and again the first words of Jesus in the gospel of Mark, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news." (Mark 1:15) Jesus calls us to observe the world around us and see signs of the very presence of the kingdom of God. Yet I fear that we too often get so caught up in our 'stuff' that we are absolutely blind to the presence of the Lord. This blindness tends to leave us wandering through life and missing out on the things that are most important.

Many of the cultural ills of the day are a direct result of such blindness. In our ever increasing violent world we tend to look at certain groups of people as strictly our enemies and forget that they too are children of God. People are racially or economically or sexually profiled and we are unable to see them as precious children to the Lord and our brothers and sisters. We see land and the resources of this world as things to be exploited and turn a blind eye to destruction which may take thousands of years to overcome. We tend to forget that all creation is sacred and is to be treated with respect. I think we forget because we are blind to the nature of God's creation.

All of life is filled with signs of God's kingdom and when we pay attention, when we open our eyes, we cannot help but see visible proof. Here is the important part of this, for me. If we can see the nearness of the kingdom of God all around us then how we live and how we treat others cannot help but be different! Care and stewardship take precedence over exploitation and neglect. When we see the nearness of the kingdom of God our lives become defined by a growing reverence for creation and our relationships with all people and living things.

Spring is that annual reminder to pay attention and look to the wonders of God unfolding all around us.



The sun is up; I'm warmer and now it's time to eat. HELLO MARSH! Maybe it isn't right to think of my concerns first, when to comes to eating but, it has been awhile since I last ate. A lot has happened in the past few weeks. Trees are budding up, plants are turning green, the local geese have started building nests and annual visitors have begun both swimming and flying in for the season of plenty and to raise new young ones.

There is another Son that has arisen also. His name is very special to all of us at the marsh and was when I lived near the farmed land. At mention of his name, all stop and pay respect for what he and his Father have done for us. Do you do the same?

When humans realize how short their lives really are, there seems to be too much to do in the time they have. We at the swamp go about our routines each day the same as you. We eat, we work for shelter and security and then we sleep, much the same as you do, I guess. You may get too busy in your day to day activities to notice all that is around you. You miss birds singing, flowers blooming, children laughing and sometimes a stranger saying good morning or hello along the way. Did you know that one in six people in the United States struggle with hunger; didn't notice that either I bet. This is according to the United States Department of Agriculture.

These times, as some older folks say, may never be easy again. I wonder if there was ever a time of plenty after the Garden of Eden departure. I hear some people fuss when they are asked to help others less fortunate than themselves but what if it were you? How would you feel if you were out of work or experiencing a shaky time? There isn't a lot of sharing taking place in the animal world in which I live. We live; we die. You on the other hand, have the ability to help others live rather than die with those simple extra donations of your time and/or your extra pennies to fight hunger in the United States each week in your offerings. I used pennies this time because today I'm thinking of small steps to end hunger, next time it could be bigger steps. None of this sharing would ever be possible without you.

Be good to each other and think more about what steps you are taking to help others.



Historical Society Box Lunch Talks



The Historical Society of Carroll County (www.hsccmd.org) holds monthly Box Lunch Talks (BLT) for the community to attend. These talks are held on the second Tuesday of every month at Grace Lutheran Church in Grace Hall at 12 Noon. (The information below is taken directly from the Historical Society's information brochure.)

The May topic will be "What's in Your Wallet? Everyday Life During the Civil War." Students of the Civil War often concentrate on strategy, tactics, and armaments. But the soldiers on both sides spent most of their time thinking of home. And what was home like? Hilda Koontz and Spencer Waldron focus on communications such as newspapers and postal service, long-distance commerce without credit cards,

currency, entertainment, education, social mores, household management, and other aspects of life on the homefront.

Participating is inexpensive and easy! Parking is free on the Carroll Street parking lot. **Please enter the building through Entrance #2 (double glass doors) on Carroll Street.** Attendees are asked to bring their lunch and will enjoy a small selection of beverages and desserts provided by Society volunteers. Please check in when you arrive! Admission is \$3 for Historical Society members and \$7 for non-members. Everyone is welcome to attend!

Walk for Water

Globally, 1.8 billion people – that's about one out of every four people – drink from contaminated water sources. According to the World Health Organization, unsafe water leads to illnesses that claim the lives of 840,000 people each year, almost half of whom are children under the age of 5.


What's more, women and children spend hours each day collecting water. This keeps them from school, work, and time with family. This keeps families and communities from learning, earning an income, and contributing to the local economy.

On Sunday, May 31, beginning at 4:00 p.m. members and friends of Grace are invited to "Walk for Water." We will begin in Grace Hall by watching a short video and participating in prayer that will help us remember the people whose lives are shaped by the lack of readily accessible clean water. Then we will walk together in the town of Westminster to acknowledge those who walk many miles a day to obtain their water.

This is an intergenerational event. People of all ages are welcome...kids in strollers are welcome! There will be several points in the walk where folks can "turn around" if they want to undertake a shorter walk.

There is no charge to participate in the Walk for Water. However, participants will be invited to give a donation when they register that day. Members and friends who are not able to participate in the walk are invited to give a donation in support of those who do walk. All of the money raised will be taken by our high school youth to the ELCA Youth Gathering in Detroit this summer where an offering will be taken to support the water projects done by ELCA World Hunger.

Growth for Ministry

Thank you for making a difference in the financial picture of Grace. At the beginning of March the leadership of our congregation announced that the bad weather of February had resulted in a deficit that ultimately went as deep as \$40,000. The message went out to you and the response has been overwhelming. The end of March showed that our deficit was reduced to \$4,899. While it is still a deficit we have moved to a place where we could indeed climb out of our financial hole.

The Finance Committee, Growth for Ministry and the Congregational Council have worked very hard to keep our spending under control and to find a way to adequately inform you of our current financial picture. Our new financial reporting page includes a balance sheet of income to expenses. Two charts help you to see our monthly income and our monthly expenses and our deficit/surplus position month to month. The greatest learning of March has been when you, the members and friends of Grace, are well-informed you are able to respond and meet the financial needs of our community of faith.




