Autumn: A Time of Transition

We have now entered the season of the year called "autumn." Perhaps you are with me in asking, "Where did the summer go?" Now, we move into weeks marked by cooler weather and more colorful landscapes. Autumn is really a time of transition. For many people, the schedule becomes more restrictive and our thoughts eventually turn to the impending days of winter.

Speaking of autumn, Parker J. Palmer, has written, "Autumn is a season of great beauty, but is also a season of decline: the days grow shorter, the light is suffused, and summer's abundance decays toward winter's death. Faced with this inevitable winter, what does nature do in autumn? She scatters the seeds that will bring new growth in the spring – and she scatters them with amazing abandon." (*Let Your Life Speak: Listening for the Voice of Vocation* NY: John Wiley & Sons, 2000)

Whether we are speaking of autumn in terms of a season of the year or as a season of our lives, we are reminded that there is a life-cycle for all of God's creatures. Each season brings with it both joys and sorrows, strengths and weaknesses. For me, the greatest strength of autumn is the reminder that God reigns over this life-cycle and so wherever we find ourselves in this path of our life journey, it is a time in which God is at work.

If you are a parent who sent a child off to school for the first time, you know what a powerful experience that is. No longer is your child only dependent upon you. He or she will come home with words and ideas that are not yours...from now on your teaching will take place in the midst of dialogue! In autumn we venture out into a big world which is constantly changing. In the midst of that change, home base becomes all the more important.

Whenever there are uncertainties and changes in our lives, we need to cling to the love that God extends to each of us. When you face loss....loss of job, loss of a loved one, loss of health, loss of life as you used to know it....these are the times when you most especially need to know that there will be spring, even if winter lies between here and there. Home base becomes so very important, whether for you that is family or friends or your church family.

Preparing them for his death, Jesus told his followers, "Unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life." (John 12: 24 & 25) In the autumn of his life on earth, Jesus looked forward to what lay ahead, even though it would be filled with suffering and loss. Jesus was able to look beyond that period of loss to see the gain of a new life without the limitations of this world.

Jesus' words give us wisdom not only about death and eternal life, but Jesus also is speaking about the experiences of daily living here in this world. Only when we let go of our focus on our own needs and desires can we open ourselves to the world around us and bear fruit that benefits others. I don't think Jesus was saying that we had to "hate" life....if we were to take that literally than surely God would not have created the beauty of changing leaves! No, Jesus was talking about focus....are we willing to give ourselves away so that others can benefit? Are we willing to hear the ideas of others and even change our own ways when we realize that someone else will benefit?

The leaves of autumn give their lives away so that fresh new leaves can bloom. That won't happen for quite a few months. That's what Parker Palmer means when he says that the seeds are planted now, even though their growth won't be seen until spring. We may not see the fruits of our labor, in fact, sometimes, what we do may seem to fall on dry soil. Yet, we don't know what is happening beneath the surface. God is at work even when the leaves are turning brown and the sun is disappearing.

I hope that all of us will enjoy these weeks of autumn. Let them be a sign to us of God's ever present work in and among us, even when the results will not be known until some future day. Enjoy the dialogues that you have with your children as they venture further and further out into the world! Give thanks for your home base that keeps you steady in times of change. Most of all, let us join in trusting our God for the love that sustains us though each and every season of life.

Perspective for Ministry

Keeping perspective is easier said than done. The ministry of Grace Lutheran Church is very exciting when you begin to look at all the things that are accomplished and supported through our community of faith. Each weekend we provide four worship services and Sunday school classes for children and adults. During the week members of our congregation along with caring friends provide lunch on Tuesday and a dinner on Thursday for people in the community who could use some help and friendship. Across the street we provide significant support for Shepherd's Staff, a community program that helps meet the needs of the poor within our area. Over the course of a week our facility provides meeting space for four different 12 Step groups that are centers of hope for people seeking to break the bondage of addictions. We are home to the Children's Chorus of Carroll County and for the monthly programs of the Historical Society. During the week our own choirs and music groups meet to rehearse and prepare for Sunday mornings. Each weekday Little Friends of Grace fills our classrooms with the joy and laughter of children who are learning and growing. There is great joy in seeing these children come to chapel where they learn about the love of God. Throughout the month a host of committees meet and strategize on how to carry out the many programs and responsibilities of our congregation. A look at our monthly calendar reflects the fullness of what we seek to do each and every day. It is exciting to be a part of such a congregation.

A look at our financial reports can be a bit disconcerting. The summer financial drought has left us with a \$65,000 deficit. It would be easy to get lost in the concern over this large deficit and begin shutting down hosts of ministries to balance the budget by means of elimination. But then we would cease to

do the important work for which we have been called as the Children of God. There is an old adage that goes something like this; "The good news is that we have all we need to fund the ministries of the Church. The bad news is that it is still in your wallets." There is indeed some truth to that adage though it shouldn't be bad news that it is in your wallets or your checking accounts. How fortunate you and I are to have resources to share with others. How wonderful that God has provided for us so richly that we have more than enough to share. The issue is a matter of perspective, sometimes we forget that our abundance is from God and that a portion of our blessing is for the sake of the work of God's kingdom. I hope that you remember that the ministries of Grace can be a significant way in which you can support the work of the gospel.

The congregational leaders and staff members of Grace are about to begin building our budget for 2016. This is a time of discernment as committees and organizations of the Church diligently seek to carefully consider what we are able to do with the resources provided by the generosity of the members of Grace. Each year there is worry about how to balance the call of Christ to serve and what we might anticipate in financial support from members and friends.

My fear is that many people assume that someone else has the resources to carry the financial burden of Grace for the work we do. As long as people make such an assumption the ministries of Grace will always be limited by scarcity. The healthier approach is for each of us to consider how best we can each serve the ministry at Grace Lutheran Church. We need to each look to our own resources and how we prioritize them to figure how best to give generously for the work of Christ in the world. The leaders of Grace strive to be extremely faithful stewards with the gifts given for the work of the Kingdom of God. I pray that out of the abundance of our generous hearts we can grow in our faithful service at Grace. I believe that the good news is that God has blessed us all with abundance so that we might give with generous and joyful hearts. Please prayerfully consider how together we can keep our perspective on abundant ministry.

Grace Lutheran Property Report – September 2015

During the month of September, we have completed the following projects:

- The retaining wall at the rear of the Carroll Street parking lot was excavated and replaced with concrete blocks. The excavation was done by L.R. Hollman and the concrete blocks were supplied by Thomas Bennett and Hunter in Westminster. Special thanks to Randy Bachtel.
- > The exterior of the Grace Hall windows were washed.
- All tile floors in the Theater, Fellowship Hall and the hallway to the south side door, the Upper Gathering Space and the hallways downstairs outside the classrooms and meeting rooms were waxed.
- > Several leaking gutters were repaired on the exterior of Grace Hall.
- We had an unexpected breakdown of the air handling system that feeds the back half of the downstairs meeting rooms. This repair was done timely and efficiently by Action Refrigeration.
- The first phase of the Lighting Retrofit and Wattage Reduction Program was done. The Stoner office building was done. The ballasts and fluorescent lights were replaced taking the total wattage of each individual fixture from 164 watts down to 100 watts.
- The old TV in the Legacy room was replaced with a flat screen, HDTV. Rooms 107 and 108 also received new, flat screen, HDTV's. All three TV's are "Smart" capable and connect to the WiFi in the building.

I am in need of a few volunteers in the next few weeks to help plant some perennial flowers and shrubs on the hill next to the Carroll Street parking lot. Many thanks to the volunteers who came and worked on Rally Day and cleared the weeds and debris.

Historical Society Box Lunch Talks

The Historical Society of Carroll County (www.hsccmd.org) holds monthly Box Lunch Talks (BLT) for the community to attend. The October topic will be "George Alfred Townsend: Pioneer War Correspondent." George Alfred Townsend was the youngest correspondent to cover the Civil War and a pioneer in newspaper

syndication. Using the pen name of GATH, he rose to fame and fortune after the war, and his career brought him into contact with presidents and luminaries such as Mark Twain. Author Diane Wiebe explores GATH's legacy of literature, his lavish summer estate near Boonsboro, and the War Correspondents Memorial Arch, a monument to his fellow wartime journalists.

Participating is inexpensive and easy! Parking is free on the Carroll Street parking lot. Please enter the building through Entrance #2 (double glass doors) on Carroll Street. Attendees are asked to bring their lunch and will enjoy a small selection of beverages and desserts provided by Society volunteers. Please check in when you arrive! The Homeless in Carroll County Need Your Help

The time has come to prepare for another season of service at the Cold Weather Shelter. The CWS provides a safe overnight refuge for the homeless who would otherwise be left out in the elements. November 15—March 31, 7:00pm until 7:00am, the Shelter opens every night, to allow those in need a warm place to sleep and a hot meal. Grace Lutheran has accepted the responsibility of providing a meal for the shelter one night per week during this time. We divide the duties of cooking casseroles and serving dinner at the shelter for the Shelter to allow people who would normally not be able to volunteer because of work or other commitments to become active with those in need.

The great thing about volunteering to serve the homeless through the Cold Weather Shelter is there are many opportunities to make a difference.

- 1-Cook Casseroles-This involves cooking casseroles that freeze well to be served at the shelter. It is done at home and on your own time. With supervision, cooking can be a service project for school age children.
- 2-Serve Dinner at the Shelter-This involves arriving at the church on Saturday at 4:30. In our kitchen you will heat the premade casseroles and then transport them to the shelter (off of Stoner Avenue) to serve the evening's guest. The time commitment for this is roughly 4:30-7:30/8:00. You must be over 18 and the schedule usually calls for service once every 4-6 weeks, not every Saturday. We have a team of volunteers that rotate serving.

If you cannot commit to one of these opportunities, we can always use supplies. Our needs are: Progressive Soups (Chicken Noodle, Tomato, and Vegetable), crackers and gallon jugs of iced tea and lemonade. You may purchase these at any time and put them in the kitchen with the label CWS.
